To save space the characters // were used to indicate a new paragraph. Male names with a red § following their names indicates that evidence suggests that their line failed due to an early death or due to there being no legitimate children. Sources follow the record in [].

Mary Kincaid of Lisnaragh, Donagheady Parish, County Tyrone (bef 1671 -).

- On 21 November 1697, Samuel Jack, son of John Jack & **Mary Kincaid** of Lisnarow (ie. Lisnaragh) was baptized [Church of Ireland, Donagheady Parish. Baptisms, 21 November 1697].
 - **Discussion:** Not enough information has been located to determine whose family this Mary Kincaid belonged to. However, Lisnaragh Scotch and Lisnaragh Irish are adjacent to Tirkernaghan and Dunnyboe. Kincaids intermarried with the Leslies of Tirkernaghan and James Kincaid was of Dunnyboe in 1713 when he married Mary Little.
- Lease dated 21 March 1763 between John Hamilton of Dunnamanagh and Daniel and William Jack of Lisnarow. Grant of that part of Lisnarow known as 'Jacks Lisnarow' then in the possession of Daniel Jack and James Jack, father of Daniel and William. To hold for the lives of John Hamilton of Dunnamanagh and Daniel and William Jack. Renewable forever (227/36, no. 145954) [Roulston, William J. Three centuries of life in a Tyrone parish: A history of Donagheady from 1600 to 1900. Strabane: Strabane History Society, 2010. p. 181-182].

Ninian Kincaid of Ballyneaner, Donaghedy Parish, County Tyrone (bef 1684 -).

- The vestry books for the Church of Ireland, Donaghedy Parish notes **Ninian Kincaid** of Ballyneaner on 10 April 1705 [Bready Ancestry. Donaghedy Church of Ireland, Vestry Book 1698-1723 . <http://www.breadyancestry.com>].
 - **Discussion:** Ballyneaner townland is on the opposite side of Eglish mountain from Ballycallaghan and Gortnaskey (i.e. immediately southeast of them).

James Kincaid of Dunnyboe, Donaghedy Parish, County Tyrone (bef 1695 -).

- **Discussion:** Dunnyboe townland, Donaghedy Parish is on the south side of Tirkernaghan townland and southwest side of Lisnaragh Irish townland.
- The marriage registers of the Church of Ireland, Donaghedy Parish records the marriage, by rule of the Consistory Court given 14th July, of **James Kincaid** to **Mary Litle** on 28 July 1713 [Abstracted by Kate Graham, spouse of Rev. Fred L. Graham (Earlsgift Rectory, 33 Langland Road, Dunamanagh, Strabane, County Tyrone, BT82 0PH) and forwarded to this author by letter dated 28 July 2000].
 - "James Hamilton, son of Sir George Hamilton of Greenlaw, owned what was described as 'one third of the balliboe of Altonisechahan' (Antishahane or Altishane). This third corresponds with Dunnyboe which formed part of the manor of Clohoggall, the rest of which was in the parish of Leckpatrick." [Roulston, William J. Three centuries of life in a Tyrone parish: A history of Donaghedy from 1600 to 1900. Strabane: Strabane History Society, 2010. p. 33].
 - "In 1713 Dunnyboe was leased to the Leslies of Tirkernaghan. In the early 1750s Abercorn attempted to get a new tenant to settle in it." [Roulston, William J. Three centuries of life in a Tyrone parish: A history of Donaghedy from 1600 to 1900. Strabane: Strabane History Society, 2010. p. 176].
 - "The Leslies also leased the townland of Dunnyboe from the Earl of Abercorn. It was in the parish of Donaghedy but belonged to the manor of Clohoggall. Because they had occupied it for so long and because it bordered the Leslies' freehold in Tirkernaghan, Abercorn was concerned that the demarcation between the two townlands had become muddles. A Mr Alexander of Limavady had purchased the woods on Tirkernaghan some time after 1702 and when his servant arrived to cut down the trees he was warned by Abercorn's agent to stay out of Dunnyboe. Despite this Alexander hired 300 men who cut down the trees on both Tirkernaghan and Dunnyboe in two days." [Roulston, William J.  - **Discussion:** John Little was in Ruskey townland in the 1664 Hearth Money Rolls for Donaghedy Parish. John Litle was in Killenny townland in the 1666 Hearth Money Rolls for Donaghedy Parish.
 - Joseph Little was made an elder of 2nd Donaghedy Presbyterian Church, Sandville in 1764 [Rutherford, Rev. John. Donaghedy Presbyterian Churches and Parish. Belfast: McCaw, Stevenson & Orr, Ltd, 1953].
 - **Discussion:** Lot 1 & 2 Codys, to the rear of George Kincaid's lands, were granted to William Little and his son John Little.
 - On 7 August 1820, William Little & John Little, his son, both farmers, petitioned for land near the head of Salmon Brook that empties into the north side of Washademoak Lake (Lots 1 & 2 in Codys). They were born in Cumberland, England and arrived in Canada the previous month. William was 55 years of age with a wife and 7 children (4 boys and 3 girls) with the youngest being 13. John Little was 26 years of age, married, with 3 children [PANB, RG10/RS108, Records of the Department of Natural Resources and Energy: Land Petitions, Original Series. William Little, Queens, 1820, microfilm #F4187. no. 975].
 - On 12 October 1822, John Little petitioned for lot 15 on the south side of Washademoak Lake. He emigrated from Carlisle, England in 1820, was 30 years old with a wife and 3 children. Had been allotted land on Salmon Creek which he wants to decline as he wants

to be nearer to his relations [PANB, RG10/RS108, Records of the Department of Natural Resources and Energy: Land Petitions, Original Series. John Little, Queens, 1822, microfilm #F4193. no. 1034].

- On 24 October 1822, William Bell Little petitioned for the land in Salmon Creek. He was 23 years old and single having arrived in 1821. He had previously applied with John Little and George Carlyle for lots 15, 16, 17 on south side of Washademoak Lake. The lands was poor so he wanted to withdraw his application for Lot 17 and instead be granted lot no. 2 Salmon Creek allocated to John Little, but who withdrew his application for the lot [PANB, RG10/RS108, Records of the Department of Natural Resources and Energy: Land Petitions, Original Series. William Bell Little, Queens, 1822, microfilm #F4193. no. 1030].
- Little, William Bell, M.D., son of William Cooper Little, was born in England in 1798 and graduated in London in 1819. He came to New Brunswick in 1820 and settled on the Washademoak, where he practised his profession till his death in 1862, during which time he was the chief practicing physician on that section of country.// ... His wife's maiden name was Mary Ann Fowler, daughter of Joshua Fowler, of St. John. He had twelve children, five sons and seven daughters. A portrait of his father, William Cooper Little, drawn by Mr. A. Fowler in 1835, now hangs in the parlor of Mr. Aaron Jenkins, son-in-law of Dr. Little [Wiggins, E. Stone. "History of Queens County, N.B: Prize Essay for The Watchman." This history included biographies on many Queens County families and was published in The Watchman, a Saint John newspaper, commencing in the October 7, 1876 issue and concluding in the February 17, 1877 issue. i. Hester Kincade (bef 19 May 1756 -).

- The baptismal registers of the Church of Ireland, Donaghedy Parish records the baptism of **Hester**, daughter of **William & Elizabeth Kincade** of Gortaleck on [19 May] 1756 [Abstracted by Kate Graham, spouse of Rev. Fred L. Graham (Earlsgift Rectory, 33 Langland Road, Dunamanagh, Strabane, County Tyrone, BT82 0PH) and forwarded to this author by letter dated 28 July 2000].

William Kincaid of County Tyrone, Ireland (bef 1813 -)

i. Mary Jane Kincaid (c1831 -).

- The Braintree Vital Records has the marriage on 2 September 1849 of **Mary Jane Kinkaid**, age 18, of Boston, born Ireland, daughter of **William Kincaid** to John Bickley, age 22, single, plasterer of Boston, born Ireland, son of John Bickley.
- It appears that Mary Jane's husband died and in the 1855 census she is found presumably living with the widow of her uncle James Kincaid. Then in the 1860 census she is with her cousin William. It is possible that she is a grand daughter of James via son William by a previous marriage.

James Kincaid of County Tyrone, Ireland later Braintree, Norfolk County, Massachusetts, USA (1776 - 22 December 1853).

- **Discussion:** James Kincaid married **Jane Glenn** (c1777 - 19 November 1860) as evidenced by her death record..
- **Discussion:** We know that James Kincaid was from County Tyrone as his son William's naturalization record states that he was born there. The Glens were found as near neighbours of the Kincaids in Donagheady Parish as evidenced by the following:
 - 10 April 1716 John Glen [Glenn] Signed; 15 April 1718 John Glen [Glenn] **Tullyard** overseer of the highways; 5 May 1718 John Glen [Glenn] **Tullyard** appl; 31 March 1719 John Glen [Glenn] **Tullyard** overseer of the highways [Bready Ancestry. Donagheady Church of Ireland, Vestry Book 1698-1723 . <http://www.breadyancestry.com>].
 - Among the earliest emigrants to America from Donagheady in the early eighteenth century. Joseph Glen emigrated in 1736 and settled in Mill Creek Hundred in Pennsylvania, while his brother James ended up in Jamaica {PRONI T/306/1}. The Glen family probably lived in Tullyard {A John Glen of Tullyard appears in the vestry book in 1718. The other sons were called John, David and Walter} [Roulston, William J. Roulston. - 16 December 1805. James Hamilton Junior, Strabane to Marquis of Abercorn, London... 'I have just come in after a long ride through the parish of "Donakiddy", and have been witness to a very decent family, who in a moment have been reduced from contentment and comfort, to extreme wretchedness and distress, by an accidental fire. He is a tenant of your Lordship's, **James Glenn of Gortmellan**. I am sure he can't have lost less than from 50 to 60 guineas worth. The neighbouring tenantry humanely collected and have made him a temporary shelter. I think he is an object of compassion upon whom £15 or £20 would be well bestowed, and which would once again set the family on their legs and make them truly happy. He tells me he has petitioned your Lordship but I could not get leaving his wife, till I promised I would represent his distressed state [Public Record Office of Northern Ireland, Belfast, UK (PRONI). D623/A/97/25].
- 31 January 1835. Marquess of Abercorn, to **John Glenn, Tullyard**, Co. Tyrone. Lease for one life or 21 years of 65a.3r.18p. Statute measure of land at Tullyard. Rent £38.4.2. Covenants with all rights, members, privileges and appurtenances belonging or appertaining [Public Record Office of Northern Ireland, Belfast, UK (PRONI). D623/B/12/364].

- **James Kincaid**, male, age 77 years, weaver in Ireland, b. Ireland, died of old age in Braintree on 22 December 1853. His death record does not list parents [Massachusetts Vital Records, 1841–1910. Braintree, vol. 76, p. 142, no. 50. From original records held by the Massachusetts Archives. Online database: NewEnglandAncestors.org, New England Historic Genealogical Society, 2004].
- NEHGS records the gravestone of **James Kincaid**, died 23 December 1853 age 77 in the Elm St. Cemetery, Old Braintree. NEHGS also records the gravestone of **Thomas Kincaid**, died 8 June 1854 age 33 in the Elm St. Cemetery, Old Braintree. Both gravestones were removed and a monument erected. NEHGS notes that the monument records **William Kincaid** 1830-1904; **Sarah Allen Kincaid**, his wife, 1831-1911; **James Kincaid** 1776-1853; and **Thomas Kincaid**, his son, 1821-1854.
- **Jane Kincaid**, female, widow, age 80, b. Ireland, **daughter of Albert and Ann Glenn** (both born in Ireland) who died of old age and bronchitis for two months at Boston on 19 November 1860 [Massachusetts Vital Records, 1841–1910. Boston, vol. 140, p. 135, no. 70. From original records held by the Massachusetts Archives. Online database: NewEnglandAncestors.org, New England Historic Genealogical Society, 2004].
 - i. Mary Ann Kincaid (c1828 -).
 - It is not certain if she is a daughter of James and Jane (Glenn) Kincaid, but she fits as having married Michael Costello and both are living with her parents in the 1850 census.
 - ii. **James Kincaid** (c1829 - 5 January 1859).
 - **James Kincaid**, male, bootmaker, age 29 years, b. Ireland, son of **James and Jane Kincaid** died of consumption at Braintree on 5 January 1859 [Massachusetts Vital Records, 1841–1910. Braintree, vol. 130, p. 143, no. 1. From original records held by the Massachusetts Archives. Online database: NewEnglandAncestors.org, New England Historic Genealogical Society, 2004].
 - iii. Nancy Kincaid (c1830 -).
 - In the 1850 census of her father's household, see above, Nancy appears to have had a illegitimate son William White (aged 1) who was born in Massachusetts. They appear in the 1855 census of Braintree in the household of William Carey.

 - **Thomas Kincaid**, male, age 33 years, b. Ireland, son of **James and Jane Kincaid** died of accidental causes at Milton on 28 June 1854 [Massachusetts Vital Records, 1841–1910. Braintree, vol. 85, p. 148, no. 23. From original records held by the Massachusetts Archives. Online database: NewEnglandAncestors.org, New England Historic Genealogical Society, 2004]. The age does not match up with the census records.
 - v. **William Kincaid** (c1833 - 5 March 1904).
 - There is a naturalization record for **William Kincaid** dated 23 September 1854 which states that he was born on 15 April 1822 in County Tyrone. He came to America on 3 June 1846 and settled in Braintree, Norfolk County.
 - William Kincaid of Braintree, Mass., born Great Britain on 15 April 1832 was naturalized on 23 September 1854 at USDC Boston, Mass, certificate no. 11-287 [Ancestry.com. Index to New England Naturalization Petition].
 - On 6 February 1856, **William Kincaid**, 23, of Braintree, bootmaker, b. Ireland to James Kincaid,

single, was married to **Sarah Allen**, 24, of Boston, b. Ireland to George Allen, single in Boston by Charles Mason of Boston [Massachusetts Vital Records, 1841–1910. Boston, vol. 101, p. 39, no. 48. From original records held by the Massachusetts Archives. Online database: NewEnglandAncestors.org, New England Historic Genealogical Society, 2004].

- **William Kincaide**, married white male, shoemaker, age 69 years, b. Ireland, son of Thomas or Joseph Kincaide, mother unknown, both parents born in Scotland, died of pulmonary tuberculosis with dementia praecox as contributory, at Taunton Insane Hospital, Taunton on 5 March 1904. The informant was his son **Henry L. Kincaide**. He was buried in Braintree, near station (First Parish cemetery) [Massachusetts Vital Records, 1841–1910. Braintree, vol. 25, p. 107, no. 32 and Taunton vol. 90, p. 376, no. 140. From original records held by the Massachusetts Archives.  - The baptismal registers of the Church of Ireland, Donaghedy Parish records the baptism of **William**, illegitimate son of **Anne Kincaid**, of **Creggan**, and **William Lutta**, turner of Killinney on 16 March 1840 [Abstracted by Kate Graham, spouse of Rev. Fred L. Graham (Earlsgift Rectory, 33 Langland Road, Dunamanagh, Strabane, County Tyrone, BT82 0PH) and forwarded to this author by letter dated 28 July 2000].

Robert Kincaid of Dunnamanagh, County Tyrone (bef 1816 - bet 1847 & 1860).

- **Discussion:** The death certificate of his son William Kincaid indicates that he married **Margaret Gallagher** (see below). The baptisms of apparent children shows he lived at various places about Donemana; including Tirconnelly, Bunowen, and Tullyard.
 - *Sir Richard Griffith's Valuation of Ireland* for Donaghedy Parish, County Tyrone in 1860 records **Margaret Kincaid** as a tenant of Michael Maghery for a house valued at £0/15/0 at map reference 23 in Stonyfalls - Village of Dunnamanagh. Her name is listed in the Valuation Revision Books of 1860-1863 for the same holding and rents, but is crossed out and replaced with the name John Maguinness [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/22A, p. 32] and of 1864-1880 for the same [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/19A, p. 39].
 - **Discussion:** The abutting townlands of Stonyfalls and Dunnamanagh are on the southwest side of Creaghan Glebe townland.
- i. **David Kincaid of Creaghan Glebe & later Port Glasgow, Scotland** (c1833 - 7 Jul 1893).
 - On 30 July 1855, **David Kinkaid**, a full age bachelor private soldier in the Donegal militia of Ballyshannon; son of **Robert Kinkaid**, labourer, was married to **Margaret Kinkaid**, a full age spinster of Ballyshannon, daughter of **Alexander Kinkaid**, carpenter, at the Presbyterian Church in Ballyshannon, Kilbarron Parish, County Donegal, after banns according to the rites and ceremonies of the United Church of England and Ireland. The witnesses were Thomas Wilson and Joseph Wray? [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Ballyshannon, 1855, vol. 2, p. 309, no. 57; LDS film #101363].
 - **Discussion:** This David Kincaid's 1855 marriage record suggests he was born before 1834 that he was of full age. This does not match David Kincaid of Port Glasgow. The latter's age suggested by his death record (1893-47=1846) and the 1881 census (1881-38=1843). However, the latter was recorded as being 58 in the 1891 census which gives a perfectly fitting birth year of circa 1833. In addition, a birth year of 1843 or 1846 does not suit him having children starting in 1857. We also know that his wife, Margaret Kincaid, was a daughter of Alexander Kincaid, carpenter, and Mary Cummings, which fits quite well with the above Margaret Kinkaid, daughter of Alexander Kinkaid, carpenter. Finally, his the informant to his death was his brother William Kincaid of Govan, Scotland. This William was the son of Robert Kincaid and Margaret Gallagher

and spouse of Mary Long of the Donemana area. William's daughter Helen appears to be living with David in the 1881 Census of 52 Bay Street, Clark Close, Port Glasgow, Renfrew County, Scotland. There is no better fitting alternative so one has to conclude that David Kincaid of Creaghan Glebe was born about 1833, joined the military, married Margaret Kinkaid while serving in Ballyshannon, moved to the Donemana area where he had his children and then moved to Port Glasgow where he and his wife died].

- *Sir Richard Griffith's Valuation of Ireland* for Donaghedy Parish, County Tyrone in 1860 records **David Kincaid** as a tenant of Andrew Ferguson for a house valued at £0/5/0 at map reference 2b in Creaghan Glebe townland. He is listed in the Valuation Revision Books of 1860-1864 for the same holding and rents [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/6A, p. 12] as well as in the books for 1865-1879 [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/6B, p. 11] and 1880-1881 [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/6C, p. 13]. In the Valuation Revision Books of 1882-1891 his name is crossed out and first replaced with the name **Margaret Kincaid** and then Thomas Kennedy. The rents also changed and the landlord, Andrew Ferguson, was replaced by John R. Ferguson and then Robert McCauley in fee [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/6D, p. 15].
 - **Discussion:** The townland of Creghan (aka Creaghan Glebe) is on the southwest side of the townland of Bunowen.
 - **Discussion:** The landlord, Andrew Ferguson, is clearly Andrew Ferguson of Creaghan Glebe, whose wife's first name was Martha. The John R. Ferguson was his son John Robert Ferguson. The Donagheady Church of Ireland Registers of baptisms has John Robert Ferguson, son of Andrew and Martha Ferguson, farmer of Creaghan, was baptized on 2 April 1854, having been born on 4 March 1854. The Donagheady Church of Ireland confirmations 1790-1900 records John Robert Ferguson, age 18 of Creghan, confirmation on 14 July 1872. It notes he married a Wright. It also records the confirmation of Joseph Ferguson, age 18 of Creghan, on 9 March 1875. It notes that he had gone to America. The Donagheady Church of Ireland Registers of burials has Andrew Ferguson, 86 of Creghan, buried on 4 Dec 1875; Martha Ferguson, 62 of Strabane, buried 19 Jan 1885; William Ferguson, 57 of Creaghan, buried 4 May 1851; and Ann Ferguson, 87 of Creaghan, buried 27 Mar 1839.
- The Statutory Death Registers records **Margaret Kincaid's** death from phthisis pulmonalis on 9 August 1888 at Sinclair's Close, Bay Street, Port Glasgow, being 44 years old, daughter of the deceased **Alexander Kincaid**, carpenter, and the deceased **Mary Cummings**, and wife of **David Kincaid**, shipyard labourer. Her widower **David Kincaid** was present at her death [GROS, Port Glasgow District, Renfrew County, 574/00 0132. p. 44, no. 132].
- The Statutory Death Registers records **David Kincaid's** death on 7 July 1893 from broncho pneumonia at Clark's Close, Bay Street, Port Glasgow, being a 47 year old labourer, son of the deceased **Robert Kincaid**, labourer, and the deceased Margaret _____ and widower of **Margaret Kincaid**. **His brother William Kincaid**, 135 Main Street, Govan, was present at his death [GROS, District of Port Glasgow, Renfrew County, 574/00 0227. p. 76, no. 227].

Ripe Old Age. **Joseph Kinkade** is Gathered to His Fathers. His Death Occurred at His Old Home Thursday Evening, March 17th, About 8 O'clock. **Joseph Kinkade, Sr.** died rather unexpectedly at his home near Willow slough Thursday evening about 8 o'clock. He had attained a ripe old age and for several years his health had been slowly failing. The sickness which was the immediate cause of his death was of brief duration, and until a short time previous to his death was not regarded as of a very serious character. His wife and granddaughter, Margaret Hyde, were at his bedside when he died. His illness not being regarded as serious, other relatives had not been summoned. The dissolution was peaceful and painless. The deceased was a native of Ireland, being born in county Tyrone, and was 78 years, 2 months and 20 days old. Their first home in this State was near Willow slough, and there they continued to live until separated by death. To them have been born three children. The **only daughter, Mrs. Margaret Hyde**, resides in Amador county. The **oldest son, Joseph, Jr.**, has long been a resident of Woodland. **Thomas Kinkade** is town marshal of Willows. All the children and son of the grandchildren are expected to arrive today. The funeral cortege will leave the family residence at noon on Saturday. Funeral services will be held in the Catholic Church at 2 o'clock, and interment will follow in the Catholic cemetery. The deceased has been a resident of Yolo county for thirty-five years. He has been an exemplary citizen, and by honorable dealing with his fellow men he earned and retained the respect of all who knew him. His life has been of frugality and industry, and by closely attending to his own business he has accumulated a comfortable competence, and for several years has been accounted as one of the well-to-do farmers in Yolo County. He was an obliging neighbor, a good father and a devoted husband and the people of the entire community sympathize with his bereaved family [Woodland Daily Democrat, Woodland, California. 18 March 1898, page 1, column 2].

- Yolo County. - The Democrat of April 2d has this intelligence: A few days ago one of the boys at the Willow Slough school, named **Joseph Kinkade**, disobeyed the rules of the school, and upon the teacher, W. H. Edwards, attempting to enforce them, a fight ensued; in which it appears that both parties got rather roughly handled. Kinkade was a pretty health boy of twenty-two or twenty-three years, and hard to manage, but to make the matter worse he called to his assistance a man named Lassen, who was working near the school, and both pitched upon the teacher, so that in spite of him the rules were temporarily suspended. Edwards entered a complaint, and the offending parties were brought before Justice Peterson on Tuesday last, when the jury found them guilty, and there were fined \$10 each. It seems to us the severest penalty of the law should be applied in such cases. This school was broken up and the teacher left the district. He was afterwards arrested and brought up for trial on a charge of assault and battery, with what result we did not learn [Sacramento Daily Union, Sacramento, CA. Volume 39, no. 5934. Monday, 4 April 1870, page 1, column 4].

- In the Abercorn papers is a 1771 or 1781 map which gives the names of tenants of Maghereagh and shows one Patrick McGonagle in No. IV which has an acreage of 25 acres 2 roods and 15 perches of which 8.2.23 were arable, 6.0.2 were bad arable, 6.1.3 were bog pasture and 4.2.27 were bog [PRONI. D603/D1/16. Note: there are 40 perches in a rood and 4 roods in an acre]. A 1756 survey of the townland of Maghereagh found in the Abercorn papers shows No. IV was basically the same in shape but was noted as having 22 acres 0 roods and 33 perches. Of this 4.3.0 were good arable (at 15 s. per acre), 2.2.33 were ordinary arable (at 5 s./acre), 5.1.0 were good green pasture (at 4 s. per acre), 4.0.0 were bog partly stript and 5.2.0 were turf bog (no value). The total rent in 1756 was £5/13/9 [PRONI. D623/D/1/10]. There were 4 lots in the 1756 map but 5 lots in the 1771/1781 map. No. II of the 1756 map split to become Nos. II & III of the newer map while No. III of the 1756 map became No. V of the new map.
- McGonagle Here lieth the body of Patrick McGonagle who departed this life June 1769 Aged 55 years [Bready Ancestry. Grange Graveyard, Donagheady Parish, County Tyrone].

- 'John Allan, **James Kinkead**, John Cuningham and Patrick McGonigal of Maghereagh, had the use of a well in their neighbour widow Provin's farm, not only for their houses, but for bleaching their cloth and yarn; they say this was mentioned to your Lordship, at the time your Lordship gave them their land, and that widow Provin was present when your Lordship ordered John McIlHeaney, and George Buchanan of Lisdevin to cut out a few perches for that purpose, that accordingly they did cut out, one says six, the other says nine perches, that the widow is now making a French? drain that would carry away all the water and says they were but to have six perches, and that they were to pay her 2s 6d a year as trespass; they say they never heard of the trespass, nor was any demand ever made of it; they all came in this day but the widow; they say that they had a little causeway made a yard abroad through marshy ground to the well and the widow has raised it up. - The tenants of Maghereagh must pay their neighbour for the trespass [Public Record Office of Northern Ireland. D623/A/26/63 . Letter from the Earl of Abercorn in London to James Hamilton, Esq., of Strabane, dated 22 May 1785].
- At the time your Lordship was pleased to order **leases for 16 years to be made out for ten** in each of the Tyrone manors, some of them could not avail themselves of your Lordship's goodness, on account of their holding in common with others who did not merit such favour, your Lordship unwilling that the deserving should suffer, ordered that if the backward tenant paid up his rent, and a quarter's rent as a fine for being backward, that he should have a lease yet though they had immediate notice, no one paid the fine but

James Kinkead of Maghereagh £1 0s. 10d. which was credited in **May 1782** account; he is poor, and has often applied hoping to get it back [Public Record Office of Northern Ireland. D623/A/46/17. James Hamilton, Strabane, to Earl of Abercorn, dated 18 September 1785]. This account shows that James Kinkead's lease was made in 1782 for 16 years.

- **James Kinkead** of Maghereagh may have his fine returned on giving up his lease. I will not suppose he means anything else. [Public Record Office of Northern Ireland. D623/A/26/80. Letter from James, Earl of Abercorn, of Dudingston, to James Hamilton Esq., of Strabane, dated 31 October 1785].
- I will have Thoms Cuningham of Tillywhisker's leases filled; there are 'severals' I think 10 that your Lordship had ordered leases to as well as him, that were kept back as he was, by being joined with people, that were found backward in their rents; some of them may have divided; if so perhaps your Lordship would allow such of them leases; none of the backward ones availed themselves of your Lordship's indulgence but **James Kinkead** of Maghereagh who paid a quarter's rent, and got his lease, which I dare say he would not give up for many years rent, though he often spoke to me in hopes to get back the trifling fine he paid, and had I not promised to him, that I would mention it to your Lordship, he would have troubled your Lordship with a petition [Public Record Office of Northern Ireland. D623/A/46/18. Letter from James Hamilton, Strabane, to Earl of Abercorn, dated 17 November 1785].
- A list called "A Rental of the Manor of Donelong as set from November 1787 for the term of twenty one years" notes the following for Maghereagh North No. 4: "Patrick McGonegal & **James Kinkead** have a Lease of which **11 years are unexpired from November 1787.**" They were paying a rental of £12/10/0 [PRONI. D623/C/4/3]. This was clearly based on the 1756 map which had 4 lots as the later map had 5 lots in north Maghereagh. The eleven years unexpired coincides with the 16 year lease from 1782. The rent matches the rent cited in 1778 above.
- I am now beginning to make out rentals, according to the intended rents, which I will make out in the same order as the sketches sent your Lordship first setting down the tenant your Lordship let to, and then the now tenants, keeping them joined in one lease for the whole rent, and without making any distinction of their rents, save only where Mr Hood has divided them and ascertained their separate rents. I send a list of those who had an offer of leases in 1782, and did not get them; what prevented their getting them was they were joined with tenants who had not paid up; your Lordship desirous that the forward tenant should not lose his benefit, desired that I might let those know, who had been backward that if they paid up, and paid a quarter's rent for their having been defaulters that they should then have a lease with their neighbour that had been allowed one. There was but one instance where that was complied with, that was **James Kinkead** of Maghereagh, who paid of his rent and £1. 0s. 10d. as a fine and got his lease with Patrick McGonigal who had been ordered one. I have been considering the reason why your Lordship now enquires about them. I beg pardon for the liberty I take in guessing; if it is that it is because those people lost the advantage intended them for an encouragement, not by any fault of theirs, and that they are now at this distance of time noticed for it, it will be proving (if proof was wanting) that your Lordship never forgets rewarding [Public Record Office of Northern Ireland. D623/A/47/48. Letter from James Hamilton, Strabane, to Earl of Abercorn, dated 9 December 1787].
- The 1794 rental of Maghereagh No. 4 split and gives Patrick McGonagle 18.3.31 paying £4/3/4 twice a year, until May 1807 when it paid £10/4/9 twice a year, and **James Kinkead** with 6.2.24 acres paying £2/1/8 twice a year, until May 1807 when it paid £5/2/4½ twice a year. The rental page for Patrick McGonagle calls No. 4 Old Survey being **Robert Kinkeads**. It notes that James Phillips purchased Patrick McGonagles portion with Patrick reserving some land and houses for his life. The rental page for **James Kinkead** shows **his son Robert Kinkead** took it over and Robert Kinkead sold it to James Phillips on 31 Oct 1809 for £105 [PRONI. D623/C/4/3]. The four semi-annual payments by Patrick McGonagle and James Kinkead total £12/10/0 which was the rental from 1778. Rents were paid in May and November.
- He is possibly the **James Kinkaide** of Donaghedy Parish, County Tyrone who is listed on the Flax Grower's lists of 1796.
- The 1806 map showing rentals has **Robert Kinkead** in the 6.2.24 acres (6.1.24 midling arable and 0.1.0 pasture) now called No. 11 and paying £4/3/4. The same 1806 map shows Patrick McGonagle & James _____ (James ran to the edge of the page leaving no surname being given; presumably is should have been Phillips) in the 18.3.31 acres (9.2.30 midling arable, 4.3.14 improvable green & boggy, 4.1.27 bog) now called No. 10 and paying £8/6/8. It is interesting to note that the neighbours in North Maghereagh, from south to north, were James & John McIntire in No 8, widow Smith in No. 9, Patrick McGonagle and James

_____ in No. 10, John Allen in No. 12, Thomas Cunningham in No. 13, James Provins in No. 14, and Robert Alexander in No. 15 [PRONI. D623/D1/1-32].

i. **Robert Kinkead.**

- On 31 October 1809, **Robert Kinkead** sold to James Phillips his No. 10 part of Maghereagh, which he succeeded to **James Kinkead**, his father.
- **Discussion:** The buildings for Grange Foyle are closer to Robert's No. 10 than those of the southern part of Maghereagh. Furthermore, there is a burying ground noted on the maps in Grange Foyle close to Robert Kinkead's lands. There are no other burying grounds noted in any of the other townlands nearby nor in Maghereagh. The farms of north Maghereagh are literally across the road from Grange House and are pretty well within 1000m of the grave yard.
