

Kincaids of Leckpatrick parish, county Tyrone

I used the following conventions in this document: bolded name, bolded & underlined spouse, underlined important places. If a connection is not clear then "it is not certain" is added in red and underlined. Personal comments are also enclosed within {}. To save space the characters // were used to indicate a new paragraph. Male names with a red § following their names indicates that evidence suggests that their line failed due to an early death or due to there being no legitimate children. Sources follow the record in [].

Thanks also to others specifically noted within the text as having made information available. Cite them if you wish to use their contributed information. If it is my original contribution that is to be used in anyone's research, then I should be cited. A suggested citation is:

The most prominent freeholder of Leckpatrick parish, County Tyrone in the mid 1700s was John Sinclair of Holyhill who died in 1770. The son of James Sinclair of Holyhill and Elizabeth Wray of Ards, County Donegal, he was land agent to the Earl of Abercorn and High Sheriff of County Tyrone in 1732. John Sinclair's second wife was Elizabeth Knox, daughter of George Knox of Rathmullan and Moneymore, County Donegal (her brother, Andrew Knox, became the patriarch of the Knoxes of Prehen, County Londonderry). John Sinclair of Holyhill's son William Sinclair inherited his County Donegal lands while his son George inherited his County Tyrone lands. However, George died in County Limerick and his lands went to his nephew James, son of William, who became James Sinclair of Holyhill.

- A Memorial of the last will & Testament of John Sinclair late of Holyhill in the Parish of Leckpatrick and County of Tyrone Esq.r bearing date the sixth day of February one thousand seven hundred and seventy wherein among others is the following bequests. I leave to my son William Sinclair the Quarter Lands of Argyr in the parish of Lifford & County of Donegal as settled upon him at his Marr. pursuant to a Deed Entered into between his Elder bro.r James Sinclair since Dec.ed & me. I leave to my son George Sinclair all my right Title & Interest to the Towns & Lands of Holyhill & Kenachan with all their subdenominations subject to the Jointure settled upon my wife Eliz.th Sinclair at her Marriage. I also leave to my said son George Sinclair the Towns & Lands of Legfordrumon Beaghs & Knockaniller with all their subdenominations * all other Lands & Lease holds I now or hereafter shall be poss.ed of at the time of my Death he Punctually paying to his mother my beloved wife a twenty pounds a year out of said Lands of Legfordrumon Beaghs and Knockaniller. I also leave to my son George all my Goods and Chattles Plate Money due by bonds notes or otherwise with all arrear of rent Except such money & Chattles as I shall hereafter dispose of he paying my Funerall Expenses or Charges and all my Just debts and Serv.ts Wages. I also Leave to my wife Eliz.th Sinclair my house & Demesne of Holyhill for one Year untill she can Conveniently remove she paying the Blackhill rent aslo my Chaise and three horses and when she removes three of the best Cows with every kind of Plate and household furniture she brought with her and a moiety of what household Linnen has been made since she became my wife. I also leave to my said wife two hundred pounds Sterl. in Lieu of Two hundred pounds Ment.d in our Marriage Settle.m.t. The rem.r of my household furniture of every kind with all my Swords & fire arms I leave to my son George Sinclair. In Case my son William Sinclair should dye and leave no son I leave the Quarter Land of Argyr to my son George Sinclair Subject to the paym.t of Two thousand pounds to the Dau.r or Dau.rs of the s.d W.m also the Jointure of one hundred pounds settled upon his wife yearly. And if my son George dyes before he arrives at the age of twenty one Years or has no issue I then Leave Holyhill Kinachan Legfordrumon Beaghs & Knockaniller with all my other Lands to my son W.m but always subject to the Jointure of sixty pounds p[er] year settled upon my wife at Marriage and the further sum of Twenty pounds p[er] year to be paid out of Legfordrumon Beaghs & Knockaniller. And in Case he shall ever be poss.ed of Legfordrumon Beaghs and Knockaniller I order & it is my will he should pay to my wife if then living the fur. sum of five hund.d pounds over and above all former bequests but it is my will if my son George has one or more Dau.rs by his Lawfull wife he may settle all the Lands he shall be poss.ed of on her or them but it is my will that if my son W.m shall be poss.ed of Holyhill Kenachan Legfordrumon Beaghs & Knochamiller by my son Georges death with.t Issue he then may have power to settle the Quarter land of Argyr Holyhill Kenachan Legfordrumon Beaghs and Knockamiller upon his Dau.rs but if shall happen that W.m & George should both dye and leave no Lawfull issue my will is that all my Estates should go to & be poss.ed by Jn.o Jam.s Perry second son of George Perry of Mullaghmore Esq.r. I appoint my wife Elizabeth Sinclair to whom I leave fifty pounds to buy Morning John Hamilton of Strabane Esq.r Sam.l Perry of Mullaghmore Esq.r & M.r George Buchanan of Strabane Appothecary Ex.ors of this my last will & Testament to whom I leave twenty Guineas Each to buy Morning & I request Andrew Knox Esq.r will Inspect in to the Conduct of my son George which will is witnessed by James Stevenson Esq.r and Rob.t Porter Merch.t both of Strabane & Rob.t Orr of Gallony Farmer all in the County of Tyrone & this Mem.l is witnessed by the said Rob.t Orr and Thomas Buchanon of Strabane afores.d Gent. this Tenth day of April one thous.d seven hundred & seventy one. Elizabeth Sinclair (seal) Signed & Sealed in presence of Rob.t Orr ~ Thomas Buchanan. The above named Robert Orr maketh Oath that he is a subscribing witness to the will of which the above writing is a Mem.l and Saith that he saw the above named Testator John Sinclair duly Execute the said Will and that he also saw the above named Eliz.th Sinclair duly Execute the above Mem.l & that the name Rob;t Orr subs.d as a witness to the said Will & Mem.l is this Dep.ts proper name & hand writing. Rob.t Orr. Sworn before me at Strabane in the County of Tyrone this 10th day of April 1771 by viture of a Com.on to me Directed out of his Ma.tys high Court of Chancery in Ireland for taking

affid.ts in the said County & I know the Dep.t Sim Rouse Justices pres.t John Hamilton ~ Ja.s Hamilton [Northern Ireland. Registry of Deeds. Volume 286, page 151, no. 185663; registered 20 April 1771].

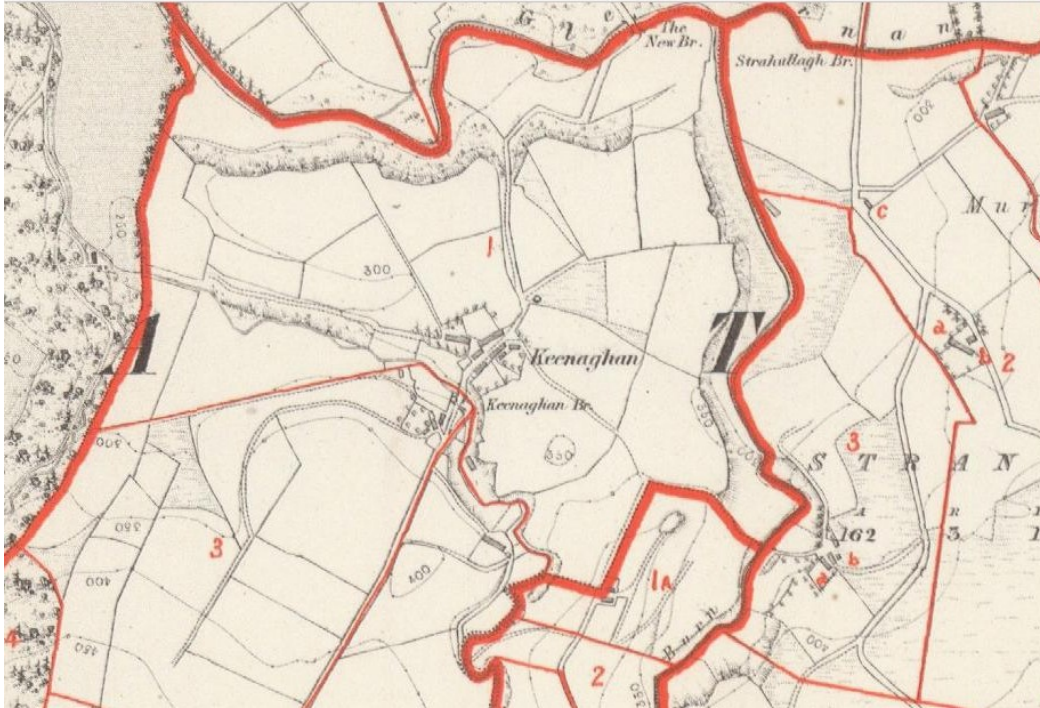
- In 1633 Bishop Andrew Knox died. He was succeeded at Rathmullan by his son Andrew, who again in his turn had two sons named Andrew and Robert.// By the time of the siege of Derry in 1688, this third Andrew had succeeded his father at Rathmullan and his cousin George had become owner of Moneymore. Andrew and George Knox were among the loyal county gentlemen who rode to the defence of Derry. George Knox was appointed Provost Marshal during the siege. He died in the following year, aged 68, probably from the effect of the privations endured throughout the siege. **He bequeathed Moneymore to the son of his cousin Andrew who was named George. Andrew had married Rebecca, daughter of Lieutenant-Colonel Robert Galbraith of Dowish. Thus it is easy to see what a favoured suitor George Knox of Rathmullan and Moneymore would have been when he found his way to Ards to seek the hand of Marian Wray. In course of time they had a family of two sons and five daughters: Andrew and George, Mary, Letitia, Elizabeth, Jane, and Angel.**// Of these daughters, Mary married, in 1730, Captain Frederick Stewart of Horn Head, and had two children-- Charles and Mary. Letitia married Thomas Atkinson of Cavangarden, Co. Donegal, in 1752, and had four sons and two daughters Rebecca and Angel. **Elizabeth married her first cousin John Sinclair of Hilly Hill, Co. Tyrone, in 1745, and left issue.** Jane married Robert Torrens and left issue. Angel married the Rev. Josiah Marshall. Their eldest son George was born in 1767. They had another son named Josiah, and four daughters, the eldest of whom married Admiral Heath of Fahan, the second, Honoria, married the Hon. John Huddleston, M.P., Director of H.E.I.C., of Down Place, Maidenhead, Berks, and left issue. Another daughter became Mrs. Stokes, and the fourth married the Rev. Francis Gouldsbury of Upper Cumber.// George Knox, the second son, took Holy Orders. He married Catherine, daughter of Francis Nesbitt of Woodhill. They had four sons and three daughters-- Letitia, Angel, and Marian.// **George Knox of Rathmullan and Moneymore died in 1741. No date is mentioned for the death of his wife Marian. He was succeeded by his eldest son Andrew, who married Honoria, daughter and Coheirress of Alexander Tomkins of Prehen, Esq.** Honoria is said to have brought beauty as well as fortune into the family. Through her Andrew Knox became the possessor of a third property, thus acquiring a very large stake in the country. He sat as M.P. for County Donegal for twenty-seven years.// Andrew and Hororia Knox had one son George, and a daughter Marianne. Her sad and romantic story is known all over the north of Ireland ... These details are quite significant and likely explains the origins of the Kincaids of Keenaghan/Silverhill who became tenants of the Sinclairs of Holyhill. First of all, in 1768, one William Kinkead was a tenant of said George Knox for lands in Moneymore. Perhaps there was a marriage conneciton between this William Kinkead and George Knox. If the Kincaids of Leckpatrick were the ancestors of the Kincaids of New Brunswick, Canada, then it could explain why this author's patriarch here, David Kincaid, named one of his sons Daniel Knox Kincaid.

- The Poll Book for County Donegal records **Wm Kinkead** in Minimore townland in 1768 as a tenant of George Knox [PRONI. T/808/14999. Poll Book for Co. Donegal, 1761-1775. p. 41].

Secondly, Moneymore, Raymoghly parish is on the west side of Dooish townland with its sub-townlands of Ballyboe Dooish and Largy Dooish as well as Dooish mountain. Also on the west side of Dooish townland is Gentle Dooish as a sub-townland of Ryelands townland, Raymoghly parish. South of Dooish is the townland of Ardagh, Taughboyne parish. To its northeast, on the other side of Milltown townland, is Monfad, All Saints Parish; the latter being on the south west side of Newtown Cunningham townland. While there is no further evidence of Kincaids in Moneymore, we can find them later in Doosih, Ardagh and Monfad (see Taughboyne Kincaids file). Furthermore, the Robisons of Silverhill came from Gentle Dooish. John Robinson of Gentle Dooish acquired his lands from Andrew Crawford of Silverhill in 1773.

- Memorial of articles of agreement dated 26 October 1773 between **Andrew Crawford of Silver hill**, Leckpatrick parish, County Tyrone, landholder, and **John Robinson of Gentledowis**, Raymockey parish, County Donegal. Assigns one half of the benefit of a Lease by the said Andrew Crawford of the lands of Silver hill aforesaid under John Sinclair, Gent. Articles witnessed by Alexander Robinson of Dowis, aged 40 years and upwards, and John Kane of Dunduffe Fort, both in County Donegal. Memorial dated 18 February 1777 witnessed by said Alexander Robinson and Richard Cowan of Lifford, County Donegal. [Ireland. Registry of Deeds. Vol. 316, p. 279, no. 211995; registered 13 May 1777].



William Kincaid (c1782 - 23 January 1864) of Silverhill townland, Leckpatrick Parish, County Tyrone.

- The *Tithe Composition Applotment Books* for County Tyrone records that on 27 July 1827 one **William Kinkead** held 13 acres 0 roods 20 perches valued at £6/7/9 for a tithe of £0/16/3 in Keenaghan townland, Leckpatrick Parish [Provincial Archives of New Brunswick. MC2081 - Tithe Composition Applotment Books, Co. Tyrone. Tab 17/2, p. 5, #167. microfilm #F21626].
- *Sir Richard Griffith's Valuation of Ireland* for Leckpatrick Parish, County Tyrone in 1860 records **William Kincaid** as a tenant of James Sinclair for house, offices and land of 8 acres, 3 roods, 10 perches and 10 acres, 3 roods, 5 perches all valued at £5/0/0 at map reference 1A & 1B in Silverhill townland. He is recorded there in the Valuation Revision Books of 1864-1880, but his name is cross out and replaced with Edward Farrell. The landlord also changes from James Sinclair to Wm Sinclair [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/22B, p. 19].
 - **Discussion:** Silverhill is enveloped on three sides by Keenaghan and is on its northern line. William would have lived at 1A where the buildings were as 1B was just an upland grazing lot with no buildings. His nearest neighbors would have been Edward & Bryan Farrell in map reference 1a & 1b Keenaghan and David McCrea in map reference 2 Keenaghan & 2 Silver Hill, Francis Collins at 3a Stranisk, William Dawley at 3b Stranisk, and Edward M'Gonigle at 2a Stranisk. Other tenants in Silverhill were said David McCrea (at map reference 2 for 5/0/10 acres), James Glackan & Hugh Glackan (at 3a & 3b respectively for 65/0/5 acres), John M'Loughlin (3c – a house), Jeremiah Dunne (4 – 22/1/5 acres), William Gordon (5a – 36/0/6 acres), Hugh Carney (5b – a house), James Dodwell (5c – a house), Edward M'Gonigle (6 – 1/2/13 acres), and John Huey (7 – 1/1/25 acres).
 - **Discussion:** The McCreas are a linking family to the Kincaids in Lisnarrow, Magherareagh, Ardagh, and Elaghmore. John McCrea (1713-1799) of Magherareagh married Sarah Stevenson. Their son Robert McCrea of Leckpatrick (1764-1847) married Anne Jack of Lisnarrow and another son John McCrea (1761-1847) married Mary Clarke of Grange. The latter's daughter, Flora Anne, married Alexander Lindsay of Elaghmore.
 - Rev. William McCrea {minister of 1st Donagheady Presbyterian Church} who played a prominent role in the dispute was a local man, being from the townland of Glencush... McCrea died unmarried at his brother's house in Glencush on 17 June 1832 at the age of 55 and was buried in Grange Graveyard. His successor was Samuel Taylor Wray who

was ordained on 7 March 1833... **Wray was from Ballyholey in the parish of Raphoe**, County Donegal, and was educated at the Royal Belfast Academical Institution [Roulston, William J. Three centuries of life in a Tyrone parish: A history of Donagheady from 1600 to 1900. Strabane: Strabane History Society, 2010. p. 138]. Note: Glencosh lies between Killyclooney and Tirkernaghan.

- Further evidence of the improvements in farming in the parish can be seen in the replies given by Robert McCrea of Grange to the Devon Commission... McCrea was himself one of the most progressive farmers in the district. He was the son of **John McCrea of Magherareagh**, and the brother of James McCrea of Lisdivin and William McCrea of South Grange. **His uncles included Robert McCrea of Leckpatrick**, Walter McCrea of Drumgauty and James McCrea of Farmhill. His farm in Grangefoyle extended to more than 170 Cunningham acres and he had acquired it by lease in April 1823. The owner of the former abbeylands of Grange at this time was John Hutton of Summerhill, County Dublin, who had bought the property from the Austins in 1821 [Roulston, William J. Three centuries of life in a Tyrone parish: A history of Donagheady from 1600 to 1900. Strabane: Strabane History Society, 2010. p. 226].
- 3 November 1829, Strabane Morning Post. Married on the 19th ult. by the Rev. Mr. Holmes, Mr **Alexander Lindsay, of Elaghmore**, to Miss Flora Anne, second daughter of **Mr. John McCrea, of Maghera**, near this town [Swindley, Len. McCrea Families of Strabane, Leckpatrick & Donagheady Parishes 1813-69. <https://cotyroneireland.com/surnames/mccrea.html>].
- 7 May 1845, Londonderry Standard. Married on the 25th ult., in the Presbyterian Church, Donemana, **William McCrea, Esq., of Leck**, to Fanny, eldest daughter of **Samuel Jack, Esq., Lisnarrow**, county Tyrone [Swindley, Len. McCrea Families of Strabane, Leckpatrick & Donagheady Parishes 1813-69. <https://cotyroneireland.com/surnames/mccrea.html>].
- 5 May 1854. Died at Farmhill, near Strabane, on the 29th ult., , aged 90 years **Mr. Robert McCrea** [Swindley, Len. McCrea Families of Strabane, Leckpatrick & Donagheady Parishes 1813-69. <https://cotyroneireland.com/surnames/mccrea.html>]. Note: This is Robert McCrea of Leckpatrick who m. Anne Jack of Lisnarrow.
- McCrea, John. Died 24 Aug,t 1878. Am.t of Assets, £135.0.0 In the name of God Amen I John McCrea of Gobnascale in the County of Tyrone Farmer being of sound mind memory and understanding do hereby make my last Will and testament in the manner following that is to say 1st I do hereby leave and bequeath to my son David McCrea the Farm of land that I now occupy in Gobnascale with all chattles thereon. 2nd I bequeath to my wife a cow to be grassed and Five £5 sterling per year to be given by my said son David McCrea during her life with a house to live in if she does not like to live with him. 3rd I bequeath to my grandson John Ardbucle the sum of Twenty £20 sterling to be paid by my son David McCrea 2 two years from the date of this will. 4th to my daughter Ann McCrea now wife of Armour McFarleon of Letterbrat, County Tyrone Farmer I leave 1 shilling. And I do nominate and appoint **Robert McCrea of Kenanghan** to be my Executor. In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal this fifteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventyeight.// John (his x mark) McCrea (seal) // John Samuel Johnston. - Will of John McCrea of Leck, died 20 January 1873, relates to his 51/2/0 acres of land in Leckpatrick, 9/3/35 acres in Farmhill called Malarkey's Field, other lands of Leckpatrick & Farmhill and part of Stoneypath [PRONI. https://apps.proni.gov.uk/WillsCalendar_IE/WillsSearchImage.aspx?id=166881].

The *Leckpatrick Presbyterian Church records* has listed **William Kincaid**, **James Kincaid** and **Esther Kincaid** in the Financial Statement for the year ending October 1863 [County Tyrone Ireland Genealogy Research. "Leckpatrick Presbyterian Church Financial Statement for Year Ending Oct. 1863: Transcribed

by Teena." <http://www.cotyronereiland.com/churchrecord/leckpatrick.html>]. The Leckpatrick Presbyterian Church is known as Artigarvan Presbyterian Church as it is located there. The Leckpatrick Church of Ireland is located in Leckpatrick.

- The Civil Registration of Deaths records the death of **William Kinkade** at Silverhill on 23 January 1864. He was a married farmer 82 years old who died from a three week spell of asthma. The informant was his son, **William Kinkade** of Silverhill [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Deaths. Strabane District, 1864, volume 2, page 309, no. 10].
 - **Discussion:** Given that his farm house in Silverhill is adjacent to the hub of Keenaghan (i.e. where the bulk of the houses are clustered) and that William was born about 1782, one can conclude that this 82 year old William was the William Kinkead in the Tithe records of Kenaghan townland. He was probably the William Kincaid in the 1860 Griffith Valuation of Silverhill, but could be his son William who was clearly living with him at that time.
- Beulah (Ferridge) Caswell is a descendant of Alexander McFarlane who was born about 1800 to Daniel McFarlane and Rebecca Monteith of Strabane. He emigrated to Cayuga, Haldimand Township, Ontario in the 1830s where he married Eliza Jane Ross. He then settled near Stratford, Ontario. She has unsourced information that his siblings included **Nancy McFarlane** who married **William Kinkade** in Strabane. She also has reliable information of a brother George McFarlane who married in Leckpatrick Mary Lindsay, spinster daughter of James Lindsay of Tullyard, on 22 August 1850. He was noted in the marriage records as a widower and farmer of Hollyhill, son of Daniel McFarland, farmer. This marriage is recorded in the Leckpatrick Presbyterian Church marriage registers (1843-1930). This George McFarland's son George Lindsay McFarlane emigrated in 1876 to his uncle in Stratford, Ontario before moving on to Silver Creek, Manitoba She notes that more information on his family can be found in the Silver Creek District History book [Post to CoTyronereiland-L@rootsweb.com on 21 August 2002 by Beulah Caswell (bmcaswell@sk.sympatico.ca) & email to this author dated 27 May 2003 from Beulah (Ferridge) Caswell of 1276 Irwin Dr, Swift Current, SK, S9H 1Z7 (bmcaswell@sk.sympatico.ca)].
- On 22 Aug 1850, George McFarland, a full age, Widower, Farmer of Hollyhill, son of Daniel McFarland, Farmer, married Mary Lindsay, a full age, spinster, of Tullyard, daughter of James Lindsay, farmer, at Leckpatrick Presbyterian Church by John Moody. The witnesses were Moses Chambers and Josiah Lindsay [Leckpatrick Presbyterian Church Marriages 1845-1930, Transcribed, compiled and submitted by Faye Logue, Tully, Queensland, Australia. <http://cotyronereiland.com/churchrecord/leckpresmar1845-1930.html>].
- William and Margaret McFarlane

William McFarlane, better known as Billy, was born in Shakespeare, Ont. in 1857, coming to Manitoba to the Silver Creek area in 1881, along with two cousins, George McFarlane and Josiah McFarlane. They came by train with all their effects as far as Winnipeg, then coming on to Silver Creek by ox cart or wagon. He farmed the S. W. 1/4 3-21-27. One of the Silverton Schools was on this farm, in the S.W. corner. All his children went to this school. His first adventure was driving a supply wagon in the Riel Rebellion of 1885.// In 1898, he married Margaret Arnott, who was born 1877, and passed away at the age of 47, leaving five young children: William Jr (Bill) - born 1901, married Winnifred Smith of Clandeboye, Man. in 1931. Bill worked for the C.N.R. on the drag line for 22 years in B.C. They had six children: Merle, Stewart, Barry, Melvin, Brian, Sharon.// Hattie - born 1903, married Wallace Keating in 1922 and they lived on the John Keating farm, and later resided in Selkirk where Hattie passed away in 1977. They had three children - two sons, Arvon and Larry and a daughter Margaret. Arvon was in the Air Force, and later became a United Church Minister; Larry was in the Navy. Margaret married William Gray.// Ross - born 1905, married Opal Angus in 1933. They had two sons, Jim (born 1934) and Wayne (born 1936). See Angus history.// Agnes - born 1907, married Leslie Switzer in 1924. They had four children - William (born 1925), Adell (born 1927), Jack (born 1931) and Ray (born 1932).// Margaret - (Maggie born 1908), married Goldie Forrest in 1928. see Forrest History.// In 1941, Billy (Sr.) was the oldest curler in Manitoba's 53rd Bonspiel in Winnipeg, at the age of 84. - George and Jennie McFarlane.

George Lindsay McFarlane was born to George and Mary McFarlane Dec. 1853 at Strabane, Ireland. In 1876, he immigrated to Stratford, Ontario. In 1881, he moved to Manitoba, to the municipality of Silver Creek and proved homestead rights on the S.W. 1/4 of 16-21-27. This was ratified under the signature of the then reigning monarch Her Majesty, Queen Victoria. In 1886, the deed to this quarter was acquired and the north-west quarter

was purchased to form the present farm. A sod house and outbuildings for the animals were constructed in 1881. Sometime later, two brothers and three sisters, also immigrated from Ireland to the district. John - homesteaded in the district for a short time before moving to San Diego, California. Rebecca - married Steve Capling and resided at Yorkton, Sask. Josiah - homesteaded at Binscarth, Man. Margaret - Mrs. John O. Keating, Silverton, Man. His limbs were patched up, but on emerging from the institution, Kincaid found that his wife, family, and some other effects had been appropriated by his man servant. Twice he tried at the County Court to recover his property, minus Mrs. Kincaid, but on each occasion he proved unsuccessful. On Friday last he was breaking in a young horse, when he received a kick on the ankle of the most damaged of his limbs, and in consequence of a sprain had to return to the

- The Geelong West Brass Band could be truly said to a continuation of one of Geelong's earliest bands.// Early in 1891, the Self Reliance Tent No. 50, Independent Order of Rechabites, Geelong decided to form a brass band. Known as the I.O.R. band, it became a feature of the growing town of Geelong and district until the latter part of 1911, when it ceased to function, the trouble stemming back to 1908 when the band competed at the Ballarat South Street Competitions, and four of its members were reported for, as we would say today, "getting on the grog", a pastime not favoured by a total abstinence society.// However, when as said the band ceased operation in 1911, the secretary, **Mr Dave Kincaid**, a well known resident of Geelong West and two others borrowed money from a bank and took over the band's uniforms, instruments, music, etc for 100 pounds, this being the money owing on the band's instruments.// On the evening of 16 October 1911, these enthusiasts met and discussed the possibility of a borough band in Geelong West. It was decided to go ahead and the well known composer and adjudicator, Mr T E Bulch, who was residing at 31 Candover Street, Geelong West, and present by invitation, appointed bandmaster. Known popularly as Tommy Bulch and a very colourful character deserves more than a mention. An excellent pianist and cornettist, he established the brass band movement as we know it today. He was also responsible for Australia's famous folk

song Waltzing Matilda, the proof and the music of which could be a feature of some future concert. This then was our first Bandmaster. ...// A dispute rose between the Council and the band later. The Council issued writs for the return of all band property, but fortunately things were smoothed over and the band continued. However, Mr Bulch's services terminated. William Kincaid aged 15 years and 7 months was appointed as conductor of the band on 22nd February 1913. Mr Kincaid conducted the band until early 1924 when he went to reside in Melbourne. • Geelong court: Car detailer accused of having up to \$500,000 in high-quality cannabis.// By Karen Matthews// A Newtown car detailer allegedly caught growing 70 kilograms of cannabis with an estimated worth of between \$350,000 and \$500,000 has been granted bail with strict conditions.// **James Kincaid**, 41, of West Fyans St, appeared in Geelong Magistrates' Court on Monday charged with cultivating a commercial quantity of cannabis and trafficking cannabis.// Police prosecutor Leading Senior Constable Kylie Jane told a bail hearing that police had executed a drugs search warrant on an industrial shed in Anomaly St, Moolap, on August 18.// Mr Kincaid had led officers to a shed where the interior had been divided into three rooms.// Sen-Constable Jane said each of the rooms was fitted out with sophisticated hydroponic setups which included an electrical bypass, lights, shrouds, heaters, scales, chemicals and shredders.// She said the place was also fitted with video surveillance and plants ranged from small clones to large healthy plants.// "The accused was arrested and made a no comment record of interview," Sen-Constable Jane said.// "He was charged and bailed and the drugs transported to Melbourne for forensic analysis.// "The scientist examining the seized cannabis found the total weight to be 70 kilograms, taking it into the realms of a commercial quantity.// "She also described it as the best quality she had seen."// Sen-Constable Jane said Mr Kincaid was subsequently rearrested and further charged with cultivating a commercial quantity of cannabis.// Nathan Goetz, for Mr Kincaid, asked that his client be granted bail saying he had no prior criminal history.// "He is a self-employed car detailer, married, the father of one child and his wife is due to give birth to the couple's second child at any time," Mr Goetz said.// "He is also the sole income earner for the family."// Magistrate Michael Coghlan said Mr Kincaid was already on bail, but was rearrested after forensic examination of the seized drug brought the total weight into the area of commercial quantity.// Mr Kincaid was granted bail with \$5000 surety and conditions he not leave Victoria, continue to reside at his current address and report to police three times a week.// The matter was then adjourned for committal mention on December 4. John Kincaid of Ballee townland, Leckpatrick Parish, County Tyrone (bef 1839 -).

- **Discussion:** Ballee is to the northwest of the townlands of Keenaghan with just the townland of Holy-hill in between.
- *Sir Richard Griffith's Valuation of Ireland* for Leckpatrick Parish, County Tyrone in 1860 records **John Kincaid** as a tenant of William Donnell jun. for house & offices valued at £0/10/0 at map reference 7 A b in Ballee townland. He is still listed as such in the Valuation Revision Books of 1865-1880 [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/5B, p. 24] and 1881 [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/5C, p. 34]. He is listed in the Valuation Revision Books of 1882-1893 for the same holding and rents but his name is crossed out [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/5D, p. 33].

Sarah Kincaid of Ballee townland, Leckpatrick Parish, County Tyrone (bef 1839 -).

- **Discussion:** Ballee is to the northwest of the townlands of Keenaghan with just the townland of Holy-hill in between.
- *Sir Richard Griffith's Valuation of Ireland* for Leckpatrick Parish, County Tyrone in 1860 records **Sarah Kincaid** as a tenant of Patrick Gallagher for house valued at £0/5/0 at map reference 14 b in Ballee townland. She is still listed as such in the Valuation Revision Books of 1865-1880 [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/5B, p. 25] and 1881 [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/5C, p. 36]. She is listed in the Valuation Revision Books of 1882-1893 for the same holding and rents but her landlord changes from Patrick Gallagher to Sarah Gallagher [PRONI. VAL/12/B/42/5D, p. 35].

Esther Kincaid of Leckpatrick Parish, County Tyrone (bef 1842 -).

- The *Leckpatrick Presbyterian Church records* has listed **Esther Kincaid** in the Financial Statement for the year ending October 1863 [County Tyrone Ireland Genealogy Research. "Leckpatrick Presbyterian Church Financial Statement for Year Ending Oct. 1863: Transcribed by Teena." <http://www.cotyroneireland.com/churchrecord/leckpatrick.html>]. The Leckpatrick Presbyterian Church is known as Artigarvan Presbyterian Church as it is located there.

Thomas Kinkade of Lack (bef 1793 -).

- **Discussion:** The town of Lack is in Magheraculmonee Parish, County Fermanagh. However, it is on the border with County Tyrone between Drumquin and Dromore and this area is also referred to as Lack, Tyrone. It is possible that this relates to Leckpatrick, Leckpatrick Parish as the townland was simply referred to as Leck (see Will of John McCrea of Leck registered on 28 May 1873)
- **Thomas Kinkade alias Thomas Kinkead**, born in Lack, Tyrone, served in the 90th Regiment of Foot and was discharged at the age of 26 having served in the period 1809-1819 [The National Archives, Kew, Richmond, Surrey, UK. WO 97/937/66. <http://catalogue.pro.gov.uk/>].

William Kinkade of Lack.

- **William Kinkade**, born in **Lack**, Tyrone, served with Ireland's Royal Garrison Artillery for the period 1872-1915 [The National Archives, Kew, Richmond, Surrey, UK. WO 96/1403. <http://www.failteromhat.com/military/londonderryga.htm>].

James McCrea of Farmhill, Leckpatrick townland, Leckpatrick parish, County Tyrone.

- **Discussion:** Farmhill is the principal estate in the townland of Leckpatrick in Leckpatrick parish, County Tyrone. It is on the north side of the parish and bounded north by Cloghcor townland and east by Pollockstown townland. Just south of it on the road to Strabane is the Church yard and then the Leckpatrick parish church. Next to Pollockstown is the townland of Stonypath.
- 15 November 1778. James Hamilton, Strabane to the Earl of Abercorn... Walter, son to John McCrea of Magereagh, a very industrious young man, purchased from the widow Hamilton, her farm in Drumgaty (new rent £22) at £130 since which, poor woman, she has died, and left two daughters and a son, with hardly anything for she was in debt, and is bound for her son George for what would be with other debts, much more than she died worth. [PRONI. D623/A/43/170].
- The Devon Commission.// In 1843 the government commissioned a major inquiry into the state of agriculture in Ireland. This commission was under the chairmanship of Lord Devon. Three men from the Leckpatrick and Dunalong area were interviewed in 1844 in the course of the inquiry. They were **Robert McCrea of Grangefoyle**, a tenant farmer, Francis O'Neill of Mount Pleasant, a linen bleacher, and James Sinclair, the landlord of Holy Hill.// McCrea was one of the most progressive farmers in the district. He was the **son of John McCrea of Magherareagh and brother of James McCrea of Lisdivin and William McCrea of South Grange. His uncles included Robert McCrea of Leckpatrick, Walter McCrea of Drumgaty and James McCrea of Farmhill.** His farm in Grangefoyle extended to more than 170 Cunningham acres and he had acquired it by lease in April 1823. The owner of the former abbeylands of Grange at this time was John Hutton of Summerhill, Co. Dublin, who had bought the property in 1821. Robert McCrea's lease for his farm in Grange was for thirty-one years or three lives and his rent was an incredible £312 per annum. His outhouses at Grange included a turnip house, piggery, hen house and stable. He played a prominent role in local affairs and was the treasurer of the Dunnamanagh dispensary and served on the Dunnamanagh district medical committee.// His cousin Frances married William Hutton of Grangefoyle and they emigrated to Canada, where Hutton became a member of the Board of Agriculture and Statistics in Toronto. In one of his regular letters back to his wife's family in Ireland, he wrote: 'I rejoice to hear of Robert of Grange succeeding so well; he is a spirited, enterprising man'. There is also evidence that Robert McCrea visited America in 1856. In that year Hutton wrote back to Ireland: 'Robert of Grange will have a great route if he goes to St Louis and thence to Guelph and Toronto. He will be able to form a great idea of our new world - as far as railroad travelling will allow him'. McCrea married firstly Flora Wallace and secondly Flora Lindsay. He died in 1886 at the age of 90. His sons included Robert McCrea junior who succeeded to the Grange farm and who served as a land commissioner, James who was a surgeon in Australia, and John who lived at Magherareagh.
