

Kincaid tidbits relating to county Antrim, Ireland

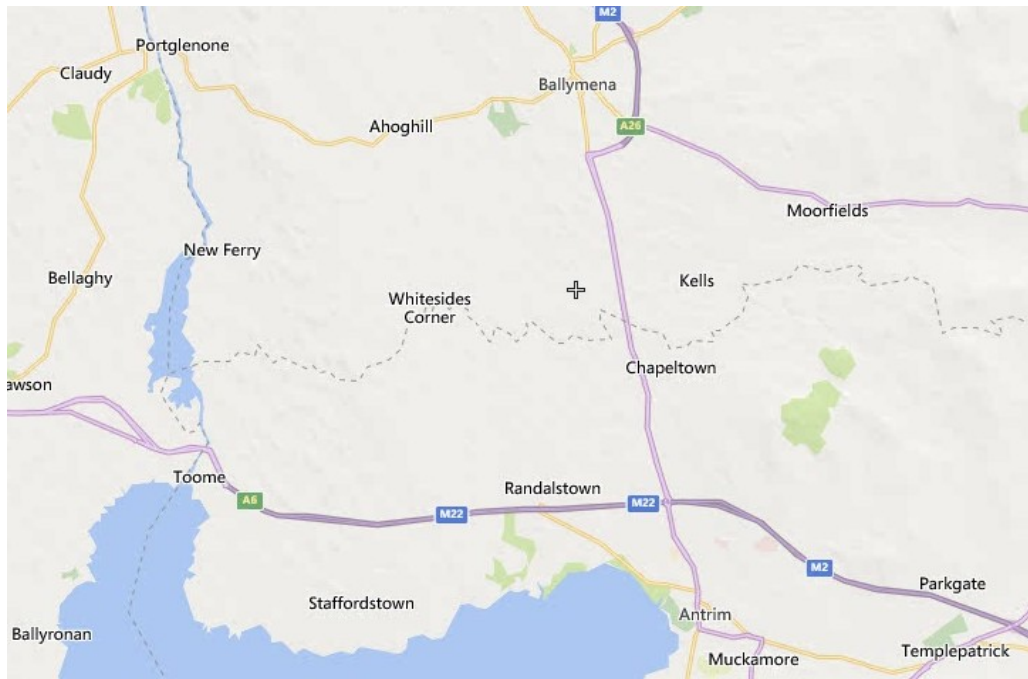

If a connection is not clear then "it is not certain" is added in red and underlined. Personal comments are also enclosed within {}. To save space the characters // were used to indicate a new paragraph. Male names with a red § following their names indicates that evidence suggests that their line failed due to an early death or due to there being no legitimate children. Sources follow the record in [].

Thanks also to others specifically noted within the text as having made information available. Cite them if you wish to use their contributed information. If it is my original contribution that is to be used in anyone's research, then I should be cited. A suggested citation is:

Early years

Robert Kinkead of Ballyclare, county Antrim (bef 1632 – aft 1669).

- On 23 May 1653, a declaration was published by the "Commissioners for the settling and securing the Province of Ulster," proposing to transplant the leading Presbyterians in the counties of Down and Antrim to certain districts in Munster. It included a list of 260 persons who were known to be attached to monarchical and Presbyterian principles and who by their status and influence were considered a danger to the ruling faction. Included for the Islandmagee, Magheramore, and Ballynure Quarters of county Antrim was **Captain Robert Kinkead** [Hanna, Charles A. The Scotch-Irish or the Scot in North Britain, North Ireland, and North America. Volume I. New York: The Knickerbocker Press, 1902. Page 604].
- The 1669 Hearth Money Rolls for Ballynure parish, county Antrim lists **Capt. Robt Kinhead in Ballyclare** townland for two hearths [Public Record Office for Northern Ireland. T/307A. Hearth Money Rolls for Counties Antrim, Derry & Tyrone, Subsidy Rolls from county Down: county Antrim pages 1-175. p. 48. As abstracted by Bob Forrest and emailed to Peter A. Kincaid on 12 March 2009]. Ballyclare is about halfway between Antrim and Carrickfergus.
- **Discussion:** Ballyclare, Ballynure parish is north of Belfast and about 8 miles northwest of Carrickfergus and 9 miles northeast of Antrim. This is likely Robert Kinkead of Hunterstown, Antermoney, Scotland who settled in Islandmagee, county Antrim, Ireland (see below).

George Kinkead of Ballyhowne, county Antrim (bef 1648 – aft 1669).

- The 1669 Hearth Money Rolls for Belfast barony, county Antrim lists **George Kinkead in Ballyhowne** (Ballyhorne) townland for one hearth [Public Record Office for Northern Ireland. T/307A. Hearth Money Rolls for Counties Antrim, Derry & Tyrone, Subsidy Rolls from county Down: county Antrim pages 1-175. p. 29. As abstracted by Bob Forrest and emailed to Peter A. Kincaid on 12 March 2009].
- **Discussion:** Ballyhowne is a townland in Carmoney parish and just below Ballyclare.

Alexander Kinkade of British, county Antrim (bef 1648 – aft 1669).

- The 1669 Hearth Money Rolls for Mazareene (Massereene) barony lists **Alexander Kinkade** as being taxed in Brytres (British) [McKavanagh, Rev. Patrick J. Glenavy: The Church of the Dwarf: 1868 - 1968. <http://www.lisburn.com/books/glenavy/glenavy-1.html>].
- The 1669 Hearth Money Rolls for Killeade parish, county Antrim lists **Alexander Kinkade in Brytes** (British) townland for one hearth [Public Record Office for Northern Ireland. T/307A. Hearth Money Rolls for Counties Antrim, Derry & Tyrone, Subsidy Rolls from county Down: county Antrim pages 1-175. p. 97. As abstracted by Bob Forrest and emailed to Peter A. Kincaid on 12 March 2009]. The townland of British is 806 acres and lies in the parish of Killead, Lower Massereene barony, county Antrim.
- **Discussion:** British townland, Killead parish, Massereene Lower barony is south of the town of Antrim and about 6 miles southeast of Shanes Castle. It is on the north side of present day Belfast International Airport which intersects its eastern part.

John Kinkead of Alcrossagh, county Antrim (bef 1648 – aft 1669).

- The 1669 Hearth Money Rolls for Armoy parish, Cary barony lists a **John Kinkead in Altirashagh** (Alcrossagh) townland for one hearth [Public Record Office for Northern Ireland. T/307A. Hearth Money Rolls for Counties Antrim, Derry & Tyrone, Subsidy Rolls from county Down: county Antrim pages 1-175. p. 12. As abstracted by Bob Forrest and emailed to Peter A. Kincaid on 12 March 2009].
- **Discussion:** Armoy parish is in the north central part of county Antrim northeast of Ballymoney and south of Ballycastle. Altirashagh is now Alcrossagh according to Bill Macafee's spreadsheet on the Heart Money rolls at <http://www.billmacafee.com/1660shearthmoneyrolls/1669hearthmoneyrollsantrim.xls>. Alcrossagh is just east of the town of Armoy.

Robert Kincaid **of Hunterstown, county, Stirling, Scotland** & Islandmagee, Antrim (c1631 – 22 Jan 1697).

- It is clear from account records in possession of author that he was of Hunterstown and that he had a **brother John Kincaid**. These records also indicate that he was the son of James Kincaid of Hunterstown.

- Robert Kincaid married **Agnes Donaldson** in Campsie parish, Stirling on 20 May 1666.
- He appears to have emigrated to county Antrim, Ireland. A Robert Kinkaid bearing the arms of Kincaid of that ilk is buried in the Ballykeel cemetery, Islandmagee, county Antrim, Ireland. The monument was transcribed as follows:
Here lyeth the body of **Robert Kinkaid** who dyed the 22 of January 1697 aged 66 and also **Agnes Donaldson**, wife, who dyed the 27 of May 1718 aged 70 years and their **son Andrew Kinkaid** who dyed the 18 of May 1725 aged 47 years. Also **Capt. John Kinkaid** died January ye ___ 1730 aged 68 years. [Memorials of the Dead of Ireland, vol. VIII, p. 220].
- i. **Jonett Kincaid.**
 - Jonett, daughter of Robert Kincaid and Agnes Donaldson, was baptized in Campsie parish, Stirling on 28 May 1667.
- ii. **Robert Kincaid** (c21 Mar 1669 -).
 - Robert, son of Robert Kincaid and Agnes Donaldson, was baptized in Campsie parish, Stirling on 21 March 1669.
- iii. **Capt. Johne Kincaid** (c12 Feb 1671 – Jan 1738).
 - Johne, son of Robert Kincaid and Agnes Donaldson, was baptized in Campsie parish, Stirling on 12 February 1671.
 - **Discussion:** The transcription of his family gravestone states that he was 68 years old. This would put a birth year of about 1662 which does not line up with baptismal records for the family. It seems likely that this was a misread for age 58 years.
 - 18 June 1734 at Londonderry. List of members of ye Gen^l Synod 1734. Templepatrick [Preb^y]. Elders ... **Jon. Kinkead** ... [Records of the General Synod of Ulster, from 1691 to 1820: In Three Volumes. Belfast, 1897. Volume 2: 1721-1777, page 199].
 - **Discussion:** This Presbytery included Islandmagee, Lisburn, Drumaul, Carmoney, Glenarm, Dunmurry, Bellykelly & Bovevy, Killeleagh, Belynure, Envor, Connor and Killead (see p. 96, etc). Capt. John Kinkaid, son of Robert Kincaid of Hunterstown has the best status to be an elder of the presbytery.

- iv. **Andrew Kincaid** (c1678 – 18 May 1725).

John Kinkead of Carnmoney, county Antrim (bef 1694 – aft 23 June 1712).

- **John Kinkead** and **Mary Smith** were married at Carmmoney, county Antrim on 23 June 1712.
- **Discussion:** Carnmoney, Carnmoney parish is on the west side of Newtownabbey. Ballyhowne is in the same parish so he could be a son of George Kinkead of Ballyhownem or perhaps the Capt. John Kincaid, son of Robert Kincaid of Hunterstown.

Thomas Kinkead of Ballymena, county Antrim (bef 1719 – aft 1739).

- **Tho[ma]s Kinkead** of Ballymenagh, Toome barony, county Antrim appears in the list of Protestant Householders of Ireland in 1740 as number 5435.
- **Discussion:** Ballymena is in the barony of Toome Lower and is part of the parishes of Ahoghill and Kirkinriola in that barony.

John Kinkead of Dunean parish, county Antrim (bef 1719 – aft 1739).

- **John Kinkead** of Dunean, Toome barony, county Antrim appears in the list of Protestant Householders of Ireland in 1740 as number 5272.
- **Discussion:** Dunean parish is on the mid western border of the county on the northside of Lough Neagh. It was part of the barony of Toome Upper. Dunean is just west of Randalstown and east of Magherafelt, county Londonderry. Toome townland on the west boundary of the parish is only about 8 miles northwest of Shane's Castle, county Antrim and about 6 miles east of Magherafelt, county Londonderry.

John Kinkead of Ballymena Presbytery, county Antrim (bef 1724 – aft 20 Jun 1749).

- 20 June 1749 at Maghrefelt. B[ally]mena Pby. Elders ... **Jon. Kinkead** [Records of the General Synod of Ulster, from 1691 to 1820: In Three Volumes. Belfast, 1897. Volume 2: 1721-1777, page 340].
- **Discussion:** The session was at Magherafelt in county Londonderry but John Kinkead was an elder representing one of the congregations in the Ballymena presbytery.

James Kinkead of Ballymena, county Antrim (bef 1746 – aft 10 Nov 1767).

- On 10 November 1767, Jane Crawford, widow of Francis Crawford, deceased, **James Kinkead, shoemaker, and Martha Kinkead otherwise Crawford, his wife**, all of Ballymena, county Antrim, conveyed to John McMurray of Ballymena, county Antrim, merchant, one half interest in a tenement with 42' frontage on the east side of North Street, Ballymena [Northern Ireland. Registry of Deeds. Crawford & ors to McMurray, no. 171906, book 258, page 331. Registered 9 August 1768].

John Kinkead of county Antrim (bef 1749 – aft 21 Dec 1770).

- On 20 & 21 December 1770, Jane, wife of Patrick Elliot, now abroad in foreign parts, Mary Ewing, widow, and Frances King, all of Randalstown, county Antrim; Andrew Allison & Margaret, his wife, of Shervoges, county Antrim; Richard Irwin & Martha, his wife; **John Kinkead & Elizabeth, his wife**; and Agnes King, a minor; demised to Thomas McAulay of Randalstown, county Antrim, Innholder, for £80, a tenement which James King, late of Randalstown, county Antrim, died seized & possessed which was conveyed by Charles O'Neil, late of Shane's Castle, Esquire, to said James King, in Randalstown, Drumall parish, county Antrim; reserving to said Jane Elliot the little house and garden left to her by said James King. To hold for the natural lives of said Jane Elliot and John King, son of William King, the younger [Northern Ireland. Registry of Deeds. Elliot & ors to McAulay, no. 197164, book 293, page 524. Registered 6 August 1773].
- **Discussion:** Shane's Castle is in the immediate vicinity of Randalstown. It was formerly called Eden-duff-carrisk but the castle's name was changed to Shane's Castle in 1722 by Shane MacBrien O'Neill. The document does not say that John Kinkead was of Randalstown. He and his wife, apparently a daughter and heir of James King of Randalstown, were joining in this deed as apparent heirs of James King. There was a daughter, Agnes King, who was a still a minor and Elizabeth was listed just before her. So Elizabeth was presumably in her early 20s suggesting that John Kinkead was likewise young and born in the 1740s.

David Kincaid of Ballymena, county Antrim (c1749 - 1810) .

- **David Kinkead** of Ballymena Town and neighbourhood, county Antrim was listed as a Dissenter in the 1775 Dissenters Petitions.
- Ulster ... Deaths... **Mr. David Kincaid** of Ballymena, aged 61 [The Belfast Monthly Magazine. Vol. 4, No. 19 (28 February 1810): 156 & Walker's Hibernian Magazine: Or Compendium of Entertaining Knowledge. Dublin, Ireland. February, 1810: 96].
- "From the age of eight he attended the school of **Mr. David Kinkade**, then a prominent teacher in Ballymena. However, Kinkade died in 1810 ..." [Dunlop, Eull. "Mid-Antrim 1983: Articles on the History of Ballymena and District; Also Including Notes, Reviews and the Record of the Mid-Antrim Historical Group 1982-1983." William Kinkead of Ballymena, county Antrim (bef 1754 – aft 1775).

- **William Kinkead** of Ballymena Town and neighbourhood, county Antrim was listed as a Dissenter in the 1775 Dissenters Petitions.

Catherine Kinked of Ballyminstra, Ahoghill parish, Toome Upper barony, county Antrim.

Samuel Kinkead of Ballydunmaul, Drummaul parish, county Antrim (bef 1788 – aft 16 Nov 1809).

- **Discussion:** Ballydunmaul is just northwest of Randalstown.
- On 16 March 1809, **Samuel Kinkead of Ballydumall, Drumall parish, county Antrim**, farmer, leased to **James Kinkead of Ballydumall**, weaver, lands in Ballydumall, barony of Tomme, county Antrim, containing 10 acres, 28 perches +/-, commencing from 1 November 1805 and for the natural live of James Thompson and for the remainder of 31 years then to come [Northern Ireland. Registry of Deeds. Kinkead to Kinkead, no. 459058, book 659, page 538. Registered 14 October 1813].
 - John Kinkead.**
 - On 8 September 1852, **John Kinkade**, a full age bachelor weaver of Mucklerames?, son of **Samuel Kinkade**, farmer, was married to **Ann Shaw**, a full age widow of Ballymena, daughter of John McKonnell at the old congregation in Randalstown, Drummaul parish, county Antrim according to Forms and Discipline of the Prebyterian Church by licence by Robert Marr. The witnesses were **Samuel Kinkade** and William Glover [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Antrim District, 1852, vol. 1, p. 81, no. 71; LDS film no. 101332].
 - The *Griffiths Valuation* of 1862 records a **John Kincaid** as a tenant of George Graham for a house and small garden valued at £2/10/0 at map reference 49 in Railway Street, Town of Ballymena (Harryville), Ballyclug parish, county Antrim.
 - Thomas Kinkead.**
 - On 3 December 1851, **Thomas Kinkead**, a 25 year old bachelor weaver of Ballydunmaul, Drummaul parish, son of **Samuel Kinkead**, weaver, was married to **Rose Morrow**, a 26 year old spinster of Grogan, Drummaul parish, daughter of Daniel Morrow, weaver, at the Registrar's Office in the Town of Ballymena according to Provisions of the Act 7 & 8 Vic . Cap. 81 by Certificate by J[ames] Greer, Registrar. Rose gave her mark. The witnesses were Rose Campbell and William Andrews [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Ballymena District, 1851, vol. 2, p. 185, no. 60; LDS film no. 101323].
 - On 15 June 1861, **Thomas Kincaid**, a 35 year old widower weaver of Groggan, Drummaul parish, **son of Samuel Kincaid**, weaver, was married to **Ellen Haddock**, a 36 year old spinster weaver of Muckrim, Duneane parish, daughter of Robert Haddock, farmer, at the Registrar's Office in the Town of Ballymena according to Provisions of the Act 7 & 8 Vic . Cap. 81 on Certificate by George White, Registrar. Both Thomas and Rose gave their mark. The witnesses were William Haddock and Nancy Haddock [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Ballymena District, 1861, vol. 2, p. 161, no. 258; LDS film no. 101423].
 - The *Griffith Valuations* of 1862 records a **Thomas Kinkead** as a tenant of Clotworthy Levingston for a house and small garden valued at £0/10/0 at map reference 11 k in Groggan townland, Drummaul parish, Upper Toome barony, Ballymena Union, county Antrim.

iii. **Samuel Kinkead.**

- On 8 September 1852, **John Kinkade**, a full age bachelor weaver of Mucklerames?, son of **Samuel Kinkade**, farmer, was married to **Ann Shaw**, a full age widow of Ballymena, daughter of John McKonnell at the old congregation in Randalstown, Drummaul parish, county Antrim according to Forms and Discipline of the Prebyterian Church by licence by Robert Marr. The witnesses were **Samuel Kinkade** and William Glover [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Antrim District, 1852, vol. 1, p. 81, no. 71; LDS film no. 101332].
- The Church of Ireland in Drummaul parish, county Antrim records the marriage of **Samuel Kinkead** and **Margaret McDowell** on 18 May 1859.
- On 18 May 1859, **Samuel Kinkead**, a 40 year old bachelor weaver of Clonkeen, son of **Samuel Kinkead**, weaver, was married to Margaret McDowell, a 45 year old spinster weaver of Clonkeen, daughter of John McDowell, farmer, at Randalstown Church, Drummaul parish, county Antrim, according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the United Church of England and Ireland by banns by Robert Hogg, vicar. They both gave their marks. The witnesses were Charles French and Alexander _____? [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Antrim District, 1859, vol. 1, p. 37, no. 88; LDS film no. 101402].

James Kincaid of Ballydunmaul, Drummaul parish, farmer

- On 16 March 1809, **Samuel Kinkead of Ballydumall, Drumall parish, county Antrim**, farmer, leased to **James Kinkead of Ballydumall**, weaver, lands in Ballydumall, barony of Tomme, county Antrim, containing 10 acres, 28 perches +/-, commencing from 1 November 1805 and for the natural live of James Thompson and for the remainder of 31 years then to come [Northern Ireland. Registry of Deeds. Kinkead to Kinkead, no. 459058, book 659, page 538. Registered 14 October 1813].

i. **Samuel Kincaid.**

- The Old Presbyterian Church in Randalstown, Drummaul parish, county Antrim records the marriage of **Samuel Kinkade** and **Matilda Robinson** on 2 May 1854.
- On 2 May 1854, **Sam[ue]l Kinkade**, a full age bachelor farmer of Ballydunmaul, son of **James Kinkade**, farmer, was married to **Matilda Robinson**, a full age spinster of Belfast, daughter of Samuel Robinson at the old congregation Randalstown, Drummaul parish, county Antrim according to Forms and Discipline of the Prebyterian Church by licence by Robert Marr. The witnesses were W[illia]m Glover and **John Kinkade** [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Antrim District, 1854, vol. 1, p. 71, no. 99; LDS film no. 101352].

John Kinkead of Carrickfergus, county Antrim.

- On 21 May 1849, **Mary Gray**, a 26 year old widow of Gardener Street, Belfast, **daughter of William Kincaid, barber**, was married to **Felix McGrath**, a 22 year old bachelor labourer of Gardener Street, Belfast, son of James McGrath, labourer at the Registrar's Office in the Town of Belfast, county Antrim according to the provisions of Act 7 & 8 Vic ch 81 by Certificate, by

William McComb, Registrar. They both gave their mark. The witnesses were William Nelson and Jane Rielly [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Belfast District, 1849, vol. 3, p. 116, no. 29; LDS film no. 101304].

George Kinkade, farmer, of Ballydunmaul (Randalstown), Drummaul parish, county Antrim.

i. Cathrine Kinkade.

- On 30 October 1846, Cathrine Kinkade, a full age spinster of Ballydunmaul, daughter of **George Kinkade**, farmer, was married to **Thomas Spence**, a full age bachelor weaver of Colsoyth, son of John Spence, tailor, at the old congregation in Randalstown, Drummaul parish, county Antrim according to Forms and Discipline of the Prebyterian Church by licence by W. Denham. The witnesses were **Samuel Kinkade** and John Cooper [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Antrim District, 1846, vol. 1, p. 87, no. 8; LDS film no. 101272].
- On 11 August 1853, **Catherine Spence**, a full age widow of Shervogues, daughter of **George Kinkade**, farmer, was married to **John Kincart**, a 21 year old bachelor weaver of Shavogues?, son of **James Kinkart**, weaver at the old congregation Randalstown, Drummaul parish, county Antrim according to Forms and Discipline of the Prebyterian Church by licence by Robert Marr. The witnesses were John Cooper and Hugh McCauley [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Antrim District, 1853, vol. 1, p. 79, no. 83; LDS film no. 101342].

ii. Mary Kinkade.

- On 31 October 1848, Mary Kinkade, a 23 year old spinster of Glenkeen, daughter of **George Kinkade**, farmer, was married to **Alexander Surgeoner**, a 25 year old bachelor weaver of Groggan, son of William Surgeoner, farmer at the Registrar's Office in the Town of Ballymena, District of Ballymena, county Antrim according to the provisions of Act 7 & 8 Vic ch 81 by Certificate, by [signature unreadable] Registrar. They both gave their mark. The witnesses were Thomas James Reid and **Samuel Kinkade** [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Ballymena District, 1848, vol. 2, p. 133, no. 49; LDS film no. 101293].

iii. Jane Kinkade.

- On 12 August 1850, Jane Kinkade, a full age spinster of Magherabeg, daughter of **George Kinkade**, farmer, was married to **John Cooper**, a full age bachelor farmer of Magherabeg, son of John Cooper, farmer, at the old congregation in Randalstown, Drummaul parish, county Antrim according to Forms and Discipline of the Prebyterian Church by license by Robert Marr.
