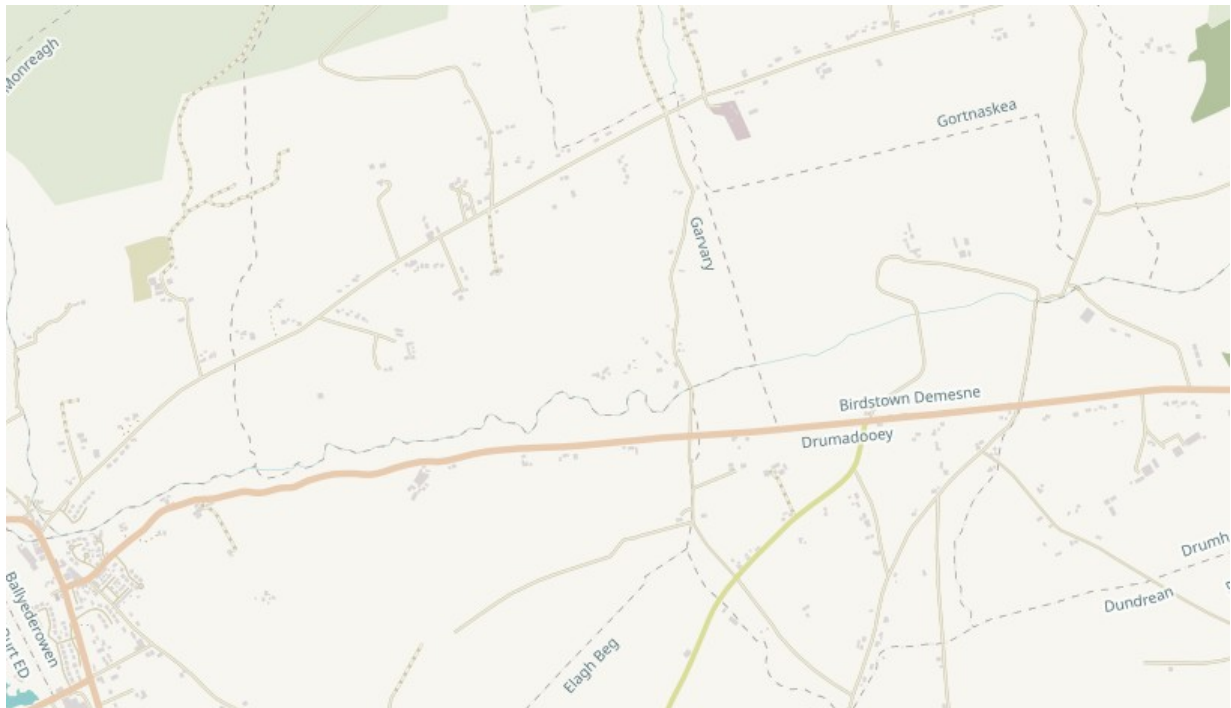

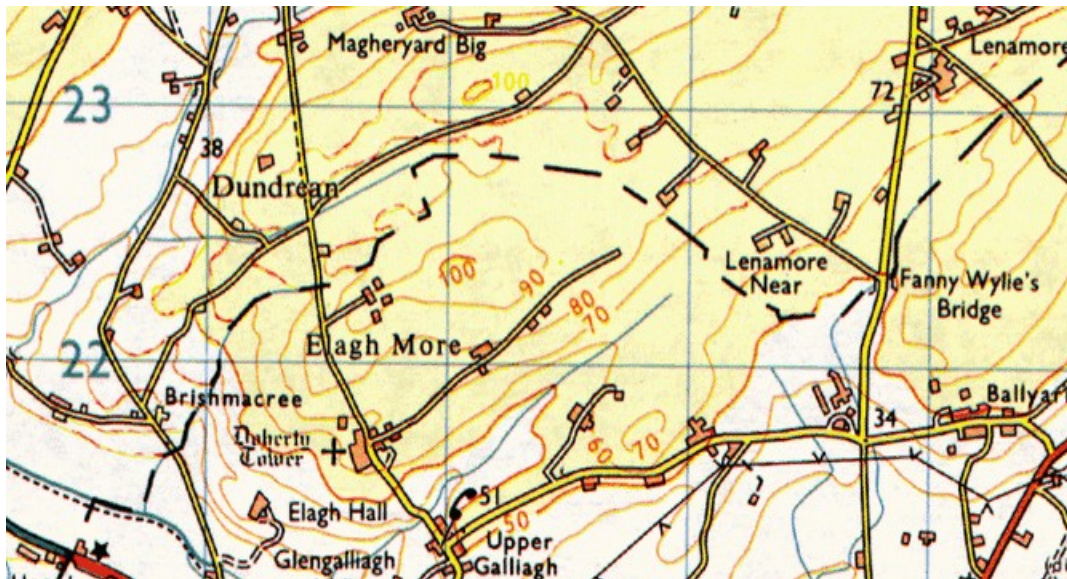

William Kinkead of Garvery townland, Fahan Parish, County Donegal (bef 1644 -).

- **William Kinkead** is recorded in the 1665 Hearth Money Rolls for one hearth in Garvery (ie. Garvary) townland in Fawthen (ie. Fahan) Parish.
- **Discussion:** Fahan Parish is broken into an Upper and Lower part. Garvary is located in the Upper part known as Fahan Upper Parish. This Parish is bounded on the north by Fahan Lower Parish, on the East by Muff Parish, on the south by Burt Parish, and on the west by Lough Swilly. Garvary is a townland of 710 acres and is in the south east corner of the Parish. Ballyederowen townland, Burt Parish is to the south, Monreagh townland (aka Kilmackilvenny, Barr of) is to the west and northwest, Gortnaskea townland is to the northeast, Birdstown Demesne townland is to the east and Drumadooey townland is to the southeast. Just below Ballyederowen is Elaghbeg and then Dundrean. From the 1654 Civil Survey of the Parish of Fawthen, Barony of Enishowen, County Donegal, we learn that all the lands in the Parish, excepting Muffkinagoe, were held by Arthur Lord Chichester, Lord Viscount Carrickfargus.



Mary Kincair of Elaghmore, Templemore Parish, County Londonderry (bef 1810 – aft 1831).

- **Discussion:** Kincair is an unusual name and may have meant Kincaid or Kincaird. It is given here in case they were Kincaids. A number of sites (including Bill Macafee's index of the 1831 census of Londonderry record this as a Kinkead. One assumes that she is a widow. There appears to be 3 sons and a daughter in the household).

John Kincaid of Elaghmore townland, Templemore Parish, County Londonderry (bef 1782 – aft 1831).

- **Discussion:** John Kincaid of Elaghmore was perhaps the same person as John Kincaid of Dundrean, Burt Parish, County Donegal - the adjacent townland.
- On 26 February 1803, Thomas Preston of Elagh More, Co. Londonderry, gave a lease to **John Kinkead** of Greenhills, Co. Donegal, for 12 acres and 21 perches in Elagh More, Co. Londonderry, paying a rent of £20 9s 6d for the term of 21 years [Public Record Office of Northern Ireland. D4174/A/3].
- **Discussion:** Greenhill is a 100 acre townland in Aghanunshin Parish and a 8 acre townland in Stranorlar Parish. There is also a Greenhill that is part of Tonagh townland in Taughboyne Parish. It is uncertain which applies but Kincaids had a more numerous and longer lasting presence in Taughboyne parish so one has to suspect Tonagh first. Since he was acquiring a leasehold interest

it is assumed that he was at least 21 years old and thus born before 1782.

- 17 May 1753. Nathaniel Nisbitt, Lifford, Co. Donegal to the Earl of Abercorn, Cavendish Square, London. "**One Widow Cox, who lives in a denomination of Tonaugh, call'd Greenhill** ask'd me leave the other day, to draw a drain through her turff bog in order to improve a peice of meadow lying below it, as I saw the thing was a real improvement I consented; I have droe the inhabitants of Carragens out of the main turff bog of Tonaugh; I have spent the best part of 3 days already, in laying out the bog in proper drains for your Lordship's tenants, and I beleive it will cost me more time before I shall gett them to cutt in a regular manner, by which means your Lordship's turberie will be preserved, and where the turff is from time to time cutt, made profitable land, which is not worth a peny and acre at present. I mett Mr. Hamilton the clergyman, who manages for his brother Mr. Henry Hamilton the other day when I was in the bog, and beg'd I might allowe Carragen people to cutt some turff in that part of Tonagh, that is sett to the people of Carragens in Town Parks [PRONI. T2541/IA/1/2/152].
- 19 December 1766. I for some years past have been living on part of the lease which by your Lordships consent I bought from Mrs Hamilton; what now is in my hands he had set to his tenants in Caregans to accommodate them in turf bog and graising; there was no sort of house on any part of it nor have they cut any turf here since I bought the lease, as your Lordship did not allow them that liberty; their leases mostly expired ten or eleven years ago, I have not set any part of it since it came into my hands. At that time what I possessed in Cloghogle was out of lease; I told Hugh and James Rankin that I bought Mr Hamiltons lease with the veiw to settle my children about me there and not to set any part of it that then I coud accommodate them in Cloghogle where I did not expect they wou'd be disturbed, that when their leases expired I certainly wou'd take into my hands what they possessed and to prevent their being put to any inconveniency I wou'd then take their farm and give them one what size they chose and twenty one years lease on reasonable terms on account of their giving me up so many years of their lease, but they refused coming to any terms with me and said they wou'd hold the lease they had which expired the twelfth day of November last so when your Lordship appointed me Seneschall they refused paying me leet mony as tenants and said they were only cotters to Mr Hamilton and appeared as such; Mr Hamilton set a lease to **Charles Cox and one Andrew Cox of part of Tannogh**; Andrew died, his representatives, etc, Charles Cox sold their leases to Mr William Boyd a tenant to Mr Forward who cut it in tenaments to accommodate his labourers and such as were usefull to him; the twelfth of November last I applyed for possession; Mr Boyd told me as his term was expired he gave up his title to what he possessed; the Rankins and persons who held from Mr Boyd refused giving possession; one of Mr Boyds cotters lives a mile from this in Mr Hamiltons estate and keeps his door shut to hold possession; others I am told have take places but intends giving me trouble before they remove. I do not understand that any one of what I have mentioned were ever tenants to your Lordship or family except James Finly who bought in Killy[jically what Joseph Alexander possessed and since he renewed it has sold it to young Alexander Cochran and now he tells me he has nothing to do with me and holds my land forceably; the most of these I have mentioned told me they wou'd petition your Lordship against me and lest I might be represented in an unfair light I take the liberty to write my case to your Lordship. I did not presume to purchase Mr Hamiltons lease untill I had your Lordships consent; I have six sons and two daughters and earnestly desire to settle all in my power of them under your Lordship and convenient to me on this account I paid Mr Hamilton considerably beyond the value of the yearly income; I have three sons at present fit to occupy farms and hopes your Lordship will allow me to settle them convenient to me; not one of these men who strike at my tenant right ever paid any thing except the rent agreed on for what they possess; Finly who was your Lordships tenant sold it as I have wrote you. ... I have three years of my lease unexpired from the 19 day of October last and will shew it to any one you please... [PRONI. D623/A/37/52].
- 2 June 1769. James Hamilton, Strabane, to the Earl of Abercorn. 'Under another cover your Lordship has the map and survey of Tonagh, and on the back of the survey the

names of the people who cut turf there. I am informed that **Hugh Rankin and David Rankin's father** had a lease of what they now enjoy for 27 years which expired November 1766, that they paid £14.10s.0d. rent and duties, that Mr Carey continued them at that rent and gave up all pretence of tenant right to them, upon their agreeing to pay £113.15s.0d. and that upon its being paid Mr Cary gave back £10 of it. That **Greenhill the widow Coxs's part** had same lease and paid £20, that it had been given over to one Boyd, who had it set off in small tenaments at near £50, that **William Colhoun who is son-in-law to Mr Carey** bought it, but I know not at what. **Charles and Andrew Coxs's part, John son to Tristram Carey** has it, had some lease and paid £25 for 27 years. [PRONI. D623/A/38/139].

28 July 1769. **Tristran Cary**, Tannogh, Co. Donegal, to the Earl of Abercorn... Your agent Mr James Hamilton was inquireing what rent the lease of this place paid **Mr Henry Hamilton** when I purchased it from him, upon which I took him the leases granted by Mr Hamilton to his tenants, who then enjoyed the lands; **David Rankins** family possess what he held, **Charles Cox and Andrew Cox** each had a lease and the **Rev. William Boyd bought what they possessed** and set it to cotters; that part expired November 1767; Mr Boyd claimed no interest there and gave me the possession but his cotters put me to the expence of an ejectment before they wou'd give me possession; I informed your Lordship that I had laid out some hundred pounds in building and improveing where I now live and intended going on if I had your Lordship's approbation, also of the ejectments I was under necessity of serving Mr Boyds cotters with; your agent then let me know you thought my case very fair, as it then was stated and did not mean to give me any discouragement in my improvements; upon letting the cotters know this they gave me the possession, and their sundry holdings I have given to **my son John** who keeps it in his own hands, except a small conveniency for the herd who takes care of his cattle and some labourers he keeps for labouring and incloseing the farm; he does not intend seting any part if and has it laboured and stocked with his own cattle; there is also a very good farm house newly built on it which has cost upwards of £150 and he intends incloseing it all as soon as he can get it done; **my daughter is married to William, third son to John Colhoun your late agent; he got from Jane Cox a part called Greenhill** and lives on it; we have laid out several hundred pounds to be settled under your Lordship and are improveing in the same manner as if we had it in fee farm; there is no such houses or improvements in this country as I have made on such ground as mine is naturally; I am indeavouring to force it and has sow'd sundry kinds of grass seed to find what agrees best with it. I wou'd not give your Lordship this trouble only that one of Mr Boyd's late cotters told me that he and others had prefered a petition to your Lordship and expected to get the holdings they had from Mr Boyd formerly and I did not know but they might aledge some thing to the prejudice of me or my son; this was the reason I took the liberty of troubling your Lordship with this letter which I hope you will pardon; what holding is in my hands had been set by Doctor Andrew Hamilton in lots to his tenants in Caregans; I believe their principal view in taking it was to be provided in turf. Your relation Mr Hamilton, Rector of Donaghkiddy has been here and can inform your Lordship what sort of a place this is, and whither or not I am an improveing tenant; there is now three of my family settled under your Lordship and I hope we will always behave in such a manner as to have your countenance which is the earnest desire of your Lordship's most obedient and very humble servant.' [PRONI. D623/A/38/147].

The *Tithe Composition Applotment Books* for County Londonderry records that in 1826 one **John Kinkaid** held 12 acres 17 roods 7 perches for a tithe of £1/0/8½ in Elaghmore townland, Templemore Parish [Provincial Archives of New Brunswick. MC2081 - Tithe Composition Applotment Books, Co. Londonderry. Fin 5A/91A, p. 29. microfilm #F21610].

- **Discussion:** With 3 males and 4 females in the family, he appears to have had two sons and three daughters at the time. In the 1831 Census the enumerator appears to have used one of the blank columns to give the persons racial origin. The Sc clearly stands for Scottish. He appears to have been well off as he had a servant.
- Nancy Campbell and Sera is well. Alex Willey is well. **Robert Kinkades family is well.** Samuel Bell and Martha Dunlap is well ... - PS: I had almost forgot that I may still have any friends in the old country. Will you give my best respects to Uncle Sam wife and family and to Mrs Porter's family and to all my old friends and comrades, but I suppose there is not many of them left now William Hamilton and **John Kincade** are both together in one regiment, I believe they are still alive as yet but I have not seen them since last winter. I expect to go to Washington on some business and if I had the corps that they belong to, I will enquire. John Wilson is working in the Clothing Department, I expect to see him [Letter from Sergeant Major John Laird of the 6th US Cavalry at the Headquarters First Cavalry Division, Army of the Potomac, Virginia to his mother, sisters and brother of Elaghmore, Londonderry, Ireland; dated 18 May 1865. Robert Kincaid of Londonderry & late Philadelphia, PA (c1794 Ireland - 12 Jun 1878).

- **Discussion:** James Laird writing from Philadelphia on 27 February 1852 to his mother in Elaghmore notes that family of Robert Kincade is well (see above). These Lairds were also heavily associated with the Millers as can be seen from the www.bogstown.com site. The following Robert Kincaid married **Margaret Miller** (as shown by his son Robert's death certificate) and fits well with the Robert of the Laird letters and the Elaghmore Kincaids.
- **Discussion:** Unless otherwise noted the following was posted on Worldconnect by freelanm@verizon.net.
- **Margret Kinkaid.** "I certify that **Miss Margret Kinkaid**, a native of Ireland, aged seventy years, residence in South St. above 18th St. died on the 12th Inst. {12 December 1857} of pneumonia. A. H. Graham, M.D.." [Familysearch.org. Return of a Death in the City of Philadelphia. Margert Kinkaid, 12 December 1857].
 - **It is not certain** if this is Margaret Miller, wife of Robert Kincade, but she fits timeline wise so she is placed here for reference.

Return of a Death in the City of Philadelphia. Robert Kinkade, 12 June 1878].

- **Mrs Nancy Jacobs**, a white, female, widow, b. 1824 Ireland, age 84 years, died of arterial sclerosis on 2 September 1908 in the City of Philadelphia. She was the daughter of **Robert Kinkade** (b. Ireland) and **Margaret Miller** (b. Ireland) and lived at 1532 No. Beechwood St.. She was buried on 5 September 1908 in Mt. Moriah cemetery. He was the son of **Robert Kinkade** (b. Ireland) and **Margaret Miller** (b. Ireland) and lived at 2421 So. Beulah St., 39th ward. He was buried on 17 January 1907 in Philanthropic cemetery. - **Jane Kinkade**, a white, female, married, b. 19 May 1837 Ireland, age 71 years, 7 months, 22 days, died of ericephlis on 12 January 1908 in the City of Philadelphia. She was the daughter of William Kennedy (b. Ireland) and Jane Logan (b. Ireland) and died at 2419 S. Mole St., 26th ward.  - **Joseph Kinkaid**, National Tube-works company, McKeesport, was born in Londonderry, County Donegal, Ireland, Oct. 25, 1829, son of **Robert and Margaret (Miller) Kinkaid**. He was reared in his native county, and came to Americal in 1852, locating in Philadelphia, where he resided fifteen years. Afterward he traveled from place to place in the county until 1874, in which year he located in McKeesport, where he has since made his home, and with the exception of two years has been in the employ of the National Tube-works company. Colin Begley (colinbegley22@hotmail.com) is a grandson of Jane Georgina Kinkaid. He did an autosomal dna test and is Gedmatch no. SS1946183 (also AT3300241). He has just one segment in common with the late Joseph William Kincaid of Sussex, NB, Canada and very few, if any, with others descended from my Kincaids (including Karl Kincade's line of Kincaids from Adelaide township, Middlesex County, Ontario). However, this could be due to our most recent common ancestor being at least 6 generations back.

He has another kit for Elaine Begley (PE6945979) and she does have a good size (10.6 cM) in common with the late Joseph William Kincaid (see below).

Colin's closest match is Bob Porter (see below) who is the father-in-law of Tina Porter (tinaporter279@gmail.com). Bob Porter has a dna connection to my Kincaids, but his connection to Colin Begley is likely via his Porter line given his great grandfather, Andrew Kinkaid, married Jane Porter. All in all, it appears

that the Kinkaid's of Dundrain are not of the same Kincaids as the Kincaids of the Province of New Brunswick, Canada nor the Kincaids of Adelaide township, Middlesex County, Ontario.
