Sources follow the record in [].

- Eadge to Moynagh. A Memorial of a Deed of Lease to be registred pursuant to an Act of Parliament made in Ireland for the publick registring of all Deeds Conveyances and Wills that shall be made of any Honors Mannors Lands Tenements or Hereditaments ~ An Indenture of Lease bearing date the Twenty Eighth day of Octo:r Ann. Dom. One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ten made Between Thomas Eadge of Dowish in the County of Tyrone Gent. of the one part and Hugh Moynagh of Killolagh in the said County Gent. of the other part Witnessing that the said Thomas Eadge for and in consideration of the Rents Covenants and Agreements therein mentioned Did Demise Grant and to Farm lett unto the said Hugh Moynagh All that the one full Quarter and a half of the said Town Land of Killolagh together with all and singular the Right

Members and Appurtances to the same belonging then in the said Hugh Moynagh's actual Possession by Vertue of a Lease from the said Thomas Eadge and held in Joint Tenancy with **John Kinkead dece.d** and William Dixon whereof therewere then about fourteen yeares unexpired. To have and to hold the said demised Premises to the said Hugh Moynagh his Heirs Ex:rs Adm:rs and Assignes for and during and untill the full End and Term and space of Forty Six Yeares to Comence from and imediately after the Expiration of the said mentioned Lease. Yielding and Paying therefore and therout Yearly and every Year unto the said Thomas Eadge his Ex:rs Adm:rs or Assignes the Yearly Rent of Two Pounds Sixteen Shill.s and Three pence Ster.g over and above all Taxes and other Charges (Except Quitt Rent) under diverse clauses and conditions as by the said Lease relation being thereunto had may more fully appear. Which said Lease was Witnessed by John Graham of the City of Dublin Gent and Crean Brush of Omagh in the County of Tyrone Gent. Hugh Moynagh his mark O // This Mem:ll was signed and sealed in presence of Math Clarkson Jo.n Graham. To the Register appointed by Vertue of the above mentioned Act of Parliament John Graham of the City of Dublin Gent. came this day before me and made Oath that he saw the above named Thomas Eadge duly seal and Execute the above mentioned Deed of Lease (whereof the above Writing is a Mem:ll) and that he likewise saw the above named Hugh Moynagh duly Sign and Seal the above written Mem:ll and that the Name (Jo.n Graham) subscribed as a Witness to the said Deed and Mem:ll is this Dep:ts own proper hand Writing and further deposeth that the said Mem:ll was delivered to Bruen Worthington Dep. Reg.r on Thursday the Twenty Sixth day of April 1711 at half and hour after Ten a Clock in the forenoon. Jo.n Graham. Jur. 26.o die Aprilis 1711 cor. me Bruen Worthington Dep. Jean Kinkead of Ardstraw Parish, County Tyrone (bef 1728 -).

- Ardstraw (Derry) Register. Nov. 7, 1746. **Francs Crawford & Jean Kinkead** married. Apr. 21, 1760. Wm. Younk & **Sarah Kinkead**, married. [Ritchie, Miss H. A. Rogers-Cook-Kinkead of Ireland. Thomas Kincaid of Freughmore, County Tyrone (bef 1742 -).

- Will of **Thomas Kinkead** of Frugmore. Mentions eldest dau. Ann Kinkead, 2nd dau. Sarah Kinkead, 3rd dau. Elizabeth Kinkead, 3rd dau. Isabel Kinkead. [four daughters; second 3rd probably mistake. All unmarried and under age.] Dated June 24, 1768; prov. Sept. 7, 1768 [Ritchie, Miss H. A. Rogers-Cook-Kinkead of Ireland. Unpublished paper, 1904. This is a report on research conducted for Anna Maggie (Rodgers) Furness. Church of Jesus Christ and Latter Day Saints microfilm no. 6024394].
 - **Discussion:** There are also townlands called Freughmore in Clogher Parish and Donacavey Parish. It is assumed that this related to Drumragh Parish as there are Kincaids to be found in this parish but not the others. Freughmore Parish is just a townland east of Relaghdooey townland.

Eleanor Kinkead of Archill, Ardstraw Parish, County Tyrone (bef 1766 -).

- The following suggests that Eleanor was the widow of a John Kinkead.
 - "I went yesterday, and saw the 2 little woods of Archill; they have been very well preserved by William McPheleemy of Archil's sons; on of them is very thick, the other is not so closely grown; I fixed with **John Kinkead's** who was with me at them, how they were to be thinned, and he is to fall about it on Monday se'night." [PRONI, T2541/IA/1/12/25, Letter from James Hamilton of Strabane to the Earl of Abercorn; dated 28 June 1776].
 - **Discussion:** Archill townland is on the northwest side of Drumlegagh townland and a townland southeast of Creevy townland where Kincaids were found in the mid 1800s (see below). It is southwest of Baronscourt with Letterbin, then Mullagh, then Aghasessy lying in between.


i. **John Kinkead** (bef 1790 -).

- A list in the Abercorn papers titled "A Rental of the Manor of Derrywoon for the term of twenty one years from November 1787" has one **Elenor Kinkead** equally splitting lands in Roosky with

William Law for a total rent of £7.3.9 (ie. her share was £3.11.10½) [Public Record Office for Northern Ireland. D623/C/4/7].

- A more detailed rent account books for Roosky starting in 1794 notes that these lands were No. 2 in the old survey amounting to 23 acres 1 rood and 25 perches with **Elenor Kinkead** paying £1.15.11½. William Law's ½ went to James Briden. The rents doubled to £3.13.11½ in May of 1808. Elenor Kinkead's name was crossed out and replaced with **John Kinkead**. John Kinkead appears to have succeeded in 1811. It is possible that John Kinkead took over his mother's lease. However the same list states that the lands were now Wm. Cortnan [Public Record Office for Northern Ireland. D623/C/4/7].
- **Discussion:** The Manor of Derrygoon (aka Derrywoon/Dirrywoon) is mostly in Ardstraw Parish. While there is now no Roosky in Ardstraw Parish the 1777 maps of the Abercorn estates shows a Roosky in what later became Archill townland. This is supported by references in the Abercorn estate letters where John Kerr's farm in Archill in the summer of 1814 was in 1811 referred to as John Kerr's farm in Roosky [PANB, T2541/IA/4/5/19, D623/A/127/24, T2541/IA/4/7/28]. Furthermore, the Briden's were in the adjacent townland of Drumlegagh [PRONI, T2541/IA/1/13/12]. Thus, this is not to be confused with the Rousky townland in Donaghedy parish, near Dunnamanagh, nor the Rousky townland in Badony Lower Parish; a townland south of the Gorticashel townlands.

unknown Kincaid (bef 1782 -).

- i. **James Kincaid** (1800 - 1863) of Fearn townland.
 - Unless otherwise noted the following information was from a letter to this author dated 6 November 1998 Andrew T. Kincaid, Barrister-at-Law, of Clerk Foley Owen Dixon Chambers, 205 William Street, Melbourne, Australia, 3000 DX92 (kincaids@zen.ocean.com.au).
 - *Sir Richard Griffith's Valuation of Ireland* for Urney Parish, County Tyrone in 1860 records one **James Kincaid** as a tenant of Rep. Samuel Wauchob (in chancery) for house, offices and land of 23 acres valued at £7/10/0 at map reference 16 in Fearne townland.
 - My great great grandfather was James Kincaid (b.1800 d.1863), farmer, formerly of Fearn townland, but latterly of Tullywhisker townland, County Tyrone, Northern Ireland. He was of Scotch Irish extraction. He married **Jane Watson**. They had 12 children 2 of whom Andrew (b.1846) and Thomas (b.1853) emigrated to New Zealand in 1880. James Kincaid had a brother Andrew Kincaid, also of Fearn townland, who had a large family also. I was born in New Zealand, but now live in Melbourne, Australia, where I practice law.

My great-grandfather Andrew and his brother Thomas settled in Christchurch, New Zealand upon their arrival in 1880. There they built a large house upon the proceeds of a successful business, and named it Baron's Court. I learnt some years ago that it was named after the manor house that was in their family district in Ireland! I understand that their accents resulted in them always pronouncing it " Barn's Court".

I am not yet aware of any of my Kincaids having gone to Canada, but that remains a possibility. Of the 12 children of my great great grandfather (two of whom travelled to NZ) only Anne (b 7/01/1836), Robert (b 10/01/1842) and Matthew (b 26/06/1855) are pretty much unaccounted for.

One of the 12 children William (b 11/06/1838) was convicted at the age of 15 on 10/01/1853 of "larceny after previous conviction" and sentenced to 7 years' transportation. It is most likely that he was sent to Western Australia prior to his being discharged on 14/0/1857. Although I haven't been able to devote much time to it, his name hasn't yet turned up in the extensive transportation records available in Australia

- James Kincaid was a farmer of Fearn townland but from 1850 he was from Tullywhisker townland. He was born about 1800. He died in May 1863 [Derg Parish Church, Castlederg, burials 1839-1881]. The death notice of his son Andrew in the Christchurch Star in January 1840 has Andrews mother as **Jane Watson**. She was born about 1803 and died on 24 January 1895.
- **Jane Kinkaid** died at Tullywhisker on 24 January 1895. She was a 92 year old widow annuitant who died of senile decay 2 weeks (no medical attendant). The informant was William McCarter, son-in-law, of Prospect, who was present at death [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Deaths. Strabane District, 1895. no. 1, volume 2, page 274; registered on 18 February 1895 by R. J. Roulston, Registrar].
 - i. **Joseph Baird Kincaid** (c1834 - 1907).
 - **Joseph Kincaid** married **Elizabeth Shannon** on 30 November 1860 [Church of Ireland. Urney Parish records, marriages 1860-1880].
 - On 30 November 1860, **Joseph Kincaid**, a full age bachelor farmer of **Tullywhisker**; son of **James Kincaid**, farmer, was married to **Elizabeth Shannon**, a full age spinster of Innisclin, daughter of William Shannon, farmer, at the Parish Church, Urney Parish, County Tyrone, according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the United Church of England and Ireland by license by B. B. Gough. The witnesses were Joseph McCormick and John Crawford [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Strabane District, 1860, vol. 10, p. 245, no. 5; LDS film no. 101421].
 - The death of **Joseph Baird Kincaid**, age 73, was recorded in the Strabane District registry in 1907 [General Index, Deaths Registered in Ireland during the Quarter ended 31 March, 1907, A to Y. Dublin: printed by Alexander Thom for Her Majesty's Stationery Office, 1907. LDS Film #0101603. Strabane District, volume 2, page 276].
 - i. Charlotte Elizabeth Kincaid.
 - **Charlotte Elizabeth Kincaid** was baptized on 5 November 1861 [Church of Ireland. Urney Parish records, baptisms 1850-1867].
 - ii. Jane Kincaid.
 - Jane Kincaid was baptized on 16 June 1863 [Church of Ireland. Urney Parish records, baptisms 1850-1867].
 - iii. Sarah Mary Kincaid.
 - The birth registers of Camus-juxta-Mourne records the birth of **Sarah Mary Kinkaid**, daughter of **Joseph Baird (grocer) & Elizabeth Kinkaid** of **Strabane**, on 7 May 1865 [Church of Ireland. Diocese of Derry. Camus-juxta-Mourne, Sion Mills, Urney Parish, County Tyrone. Births 1803-1873. page 68].
 - The Camus Parish Register records the birth of **Sarah Mary**, daughter of **Joseph & Elizabeth Kinkaid or Kincaid** on 7 May 1865 [Parish Register Camus Tyrone - Births & Christenings 1802-1873. Transcribed from LDS film no. 933419 by Jim Crabtree.

 - **Discussion**: Edgar Cope (1862 Cardiff, Wales -Glamorgan, 1899) m. Sarah Mary Kincaid (1865 Tyrone -)-> John H. Bennett m. Elizabeth L. M. Cope --> Frederick T. Bennett & Ernest Bennett. Presumably the above Sarah Mary Kincaid.

 - On 28 February 1861, **Ann Kincaid**, a full age spinster of Tullywhisker; daughter of **James Kincaid**, farmer, was married to **John Gourley**, a full age bachelor farmer of Leckpatrick Parish, son of James Gourley, farmer, at the Parish Church, Urney Parish, County Tyrone, according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the United Church of England and Ireland by license by B. B. Gough. The witnesses were Joseph McCormick and Joseph Shannon [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Strabane District, 1861, vol. 10, p. 240, no. 7; LDS film no. 101431].
- iii. **William Kincaid.**
 - **William Kincaid** was baptized on 11 June 1838 [Church of Ireland. Urney Parish records, baptisms 1827-1850].
- iv. **Jane Kincaid.**
 - **Jane Kincaid** was baptized on 6 February 1840 [Church of Ireland. Urney Parish records, baptisms 1827-1850].
 - **Jane Kincaid** married **John Burke** on 24 September 1868 [Church of Ireland. Urney Parish records, marriages 1860-1880].
 - On 24 September 1868, **Jane Kincaid**, a full age spinster of Tullywhisker; daughter of **James Kincaid**, farmer, was married to **John Burke**, a full age bachelor dealer of Tullywhisker, son of Robert Burke, farmer, at the Parish Church, Urney Parish, County Tyrone, according to the Rites and Ceremonies of

the United Church of England and Ireland by license by C. Seymour. The witnesses were William Shannon and Robert Kincaid [Ireland. Civil Registrations of Marriages. Strabane District, 1868, vol. 12, p. 285, no. 53; LDS film no. 101531].

v. **Robert Kincaid** (c10 Jan 1842 - 9 Mar 1891).

- **Robert Kincaid** was baptized on 10 January 1842 [Church of Ireland. Urney Parish records, baptisms 1827-1850].
- Robert Kincaid moved to Strabane and became a grocer.
- On 22 March 1877, **Robert Kincaid**, Church of Ireland, bachelor merchant, of Strabane, son of **James Kincaid**, farmer, was married to **Margaret Smith**, Church of Ireland, spinster, of **Clooney Terrace**, daughter of Samuel Smith, farmer, at St. Columb's Cathedral, County Londonderry. The witnesses were Joseph K. Kincaid and Andrew Kincaid [Derry ~ Londonderry Genealogy, Foyle Valley Railway Museum, Foyle Road, Derry, BT48, 6SQ. Online Irish Genealogy Databases for Co. Derry. Irish Genealogical Online Record Search System initiative organized by Irish Family History Foundation (<http://derry.rootsireland.ie/>; accessed 12 February 2010)].
- On 7 February 1888, **Fanny Kincaid, wife of Robert Kincaid, of Mill Street, Waterside, City of Londonderry, Cat Proprietor, to whom she was married since 31 December 1882, conveyed to said Robert Kincaid**, a lease dated 30 June 1863 of "all that and those that plot of ground situate at Clooney in the Liberties of Londonderry at the date of said lease in the possession of the said David Hutcheson and now in the possession of the said Robert Kincaid containing in front eighteen feet and from front to rear forty two feet be the same more or less and bounded on the north by a house and yard at the date of said assignment the property of William Jamison on the westerly by the wall which separates it from the Railway on the south by a house and yard the property of Robert Brown and on the east by the street which separates it from buildings known by the name of the Waterside Gas works which said premises are situate in Mill Street Waterside in the townland of Clooney parish of Glendermott half Barony of Tirkeeran and City and County of Londonderry together with the dwelling house and buildings now erected and being thereon and the rights members easements and appurtenances thereunto belonging." To hold for all the residue and unexpired of the term of forty six years. Indenture and memorial, dated 8 February 1888, witnessed by David Rankin, civil bell officer, and William McLaughlin, law clerk, both of the City of Londonderry [Northern Ireland. Registry of Deeds. 1888, volume 6, no. 56; registered 9 February 1888. <https://www.familysearch.org/ark:/61903/3:1:3Q9M-CSK3-39CL-Y?i=446&cat=185720>].
- Andrew Thomas Bunbury Kincaid came to Avonlea Saskatchewan around 1900 to be with his half brother "James Baird". We had been in belief that "Bunbury" was his mother's maiden name. ... I contacted the "Ulster Historical Society" over the internet and had them do some digging. They came up with some marvelous info much to the surprise of the older ones in our family. First off Andrew's parents were Robert Kincaid (grocer) d: Mar 9,1891. His mother's name was "Margaret Smyth" (not Bunbury) and the most surprising of all is that "James Baird" was actually "James Baird Kincaid". He was a full brother and must have dropped the Kincaid when he came to Canada. ... Besides Andrew and James there were five other children, four of them died at a very young age leaving only one a Samuel Edward Smyth Kincaid for me to search for. We were told that grandfather and a brother had originally booked passage to Australia but he changed his mind and came here instead. - The Probate of the Will of **James Kincaid**, late of Castletown, County Tyrone, Blacksmith, who died 6 December 1897, granted on 19 January 1899 at Londonderry to **Robert Kincaid** of Waterside, Londonderry, Shoemaker. He left effects of £36 15s. 6d. This is likely the Castletown townland, Urney parish on the west side of Strabane.

Secondly, I bequeath to Nancy Clarke, daughter of James Clarke and my sister Isabella Love, otherwise Clarke, twenty pounds sterling to be paid to her five years after my death and if she does not survive, I allow that sum to be paid to her sister Isabella and also thirty pounds to John Lindsay of Drumshum(?), in the County of Donegal to be paid to him six years after my death and if he does not survive I allow said sum to be paid to Margaret Armstrong or her husband. Said bequests are made to discharge two bequests which were made by my father but were not paid. Thirdly, I allow my executors to make money on my flax and oats and sell as much as will pay all expenses incurred at my death and funeral, doctor's bills and other incidental charges during my sickness and to dispose at six months credit of my crop, stock and farming utensils and all my household furniture of every description saving whatever is hereafter bequeathed in order to pay my debts and if the proceeds do not meet the demands, I allow my executors to let my farm in Milltown for 9 or 10 years and that the said income will be applied to liquidate the debt against said farm and that the remainder will be agreeably divided between John Monteith of Milltown and Andrew Laird of Urbereagh and I sincerely trust my views on this point will meet the approbation of my creditors and that they will bear with patience and encourage my executors to discharge my debts honourably and honestly which is my hearts desire and at the expiration of 9 or 10 years that my farm will be equally divided between John Love of Birnaghs and David Love of Creaghor and when David Love son of John Love of Birnaghs and Victor Love son to David Love of Creaghor arrive at the age of twenty-one years that the said John Love and David Love shall peaceably give up their respective holdings of my farm in Milltown to their respective sons my legatees, Namely David Love of Birnaghs and Victor Love of Creaghor free of all demands and encumbrances whatever on said farm and that they will pay renewal fines, yearly rents and all taxes and other charges as they become due and that the said legatees will pay unto the following persons the respective sums attached to their respective names two years after they get into possession of the Milltown farm, share and share alike. vz, £10 to David Love son to George Love of Gortavey, £10 to the eldest son of Victor Love Jr of Creaghor and £10 to the eldest daughter of Andrew Laird of Urbereagh and if the said legatees do not live to enjoy said farm the above sum to be paid by their successors in equal shares to the same named individuals or their legatees. Fourthly I bequeath to David Love of Creagor my trunk, my books, my gun and all my

regimentals, but my sword and sash I bequeath to David Love of Birnaghs. I allow my executors to buy a suit of mourning to my sister NANCY of Milltown, one to Mrs. MacLim of Newtownstewart and one to Mrs. John Hood of Newtownstewart. I also request or allow my executors to buy Jane Madden a suit of mourning and a new mantle for her services to me and one and a new cloak and two pounds to Sally Barnet when she leaves the house and I also allow Sally Barnet her bedstead and bedding which _____ in my house and allow my executors to pay Andrew MacLim of Newtownstewart £10 for the trouble he and his wife had with me during my stay at his house under the care of the doctor. And as John Monteith of Milltown and John Love of Birnaghs have bailed David Love of Creaghor in the sum of £40 to Joseph Lithgo of Carland that the said David Love is not to exercise what I have bequeathed him until he satisfies and sets at liberty the said sureties of the said £40. Fifthly I allow my executors to let the farm at Milltown to the advantage of my brother John's children who are in America namely John and James Love and Sarah Love otherwise Glasson for two years to assist in paying their expenses in applying for and crossing to it and they will give up quiet possession to them or to their legal authority by my executors exercising from them a clear discharge of all demand and now appoint James Anderson of Tiveny, James Stewart of Birnaghs and John Monteith of Milltown my trustees and executors and having confidence in them that they will act in strict conformity to the terms of my will. I revoke all others and certify and confirm this my last Will and Testament and subscribing my name this 9th day of December, one thousand and forty-five in the presence of those my witnesses.
